

The following are recommendations that I would use for this project. Feel free to try different mixes of colors, wood and grains. I used 1 1/4" thick wood to for the first row of snow make this a free standing piece. The rest of the parts were cut from 3/4" thick wood.

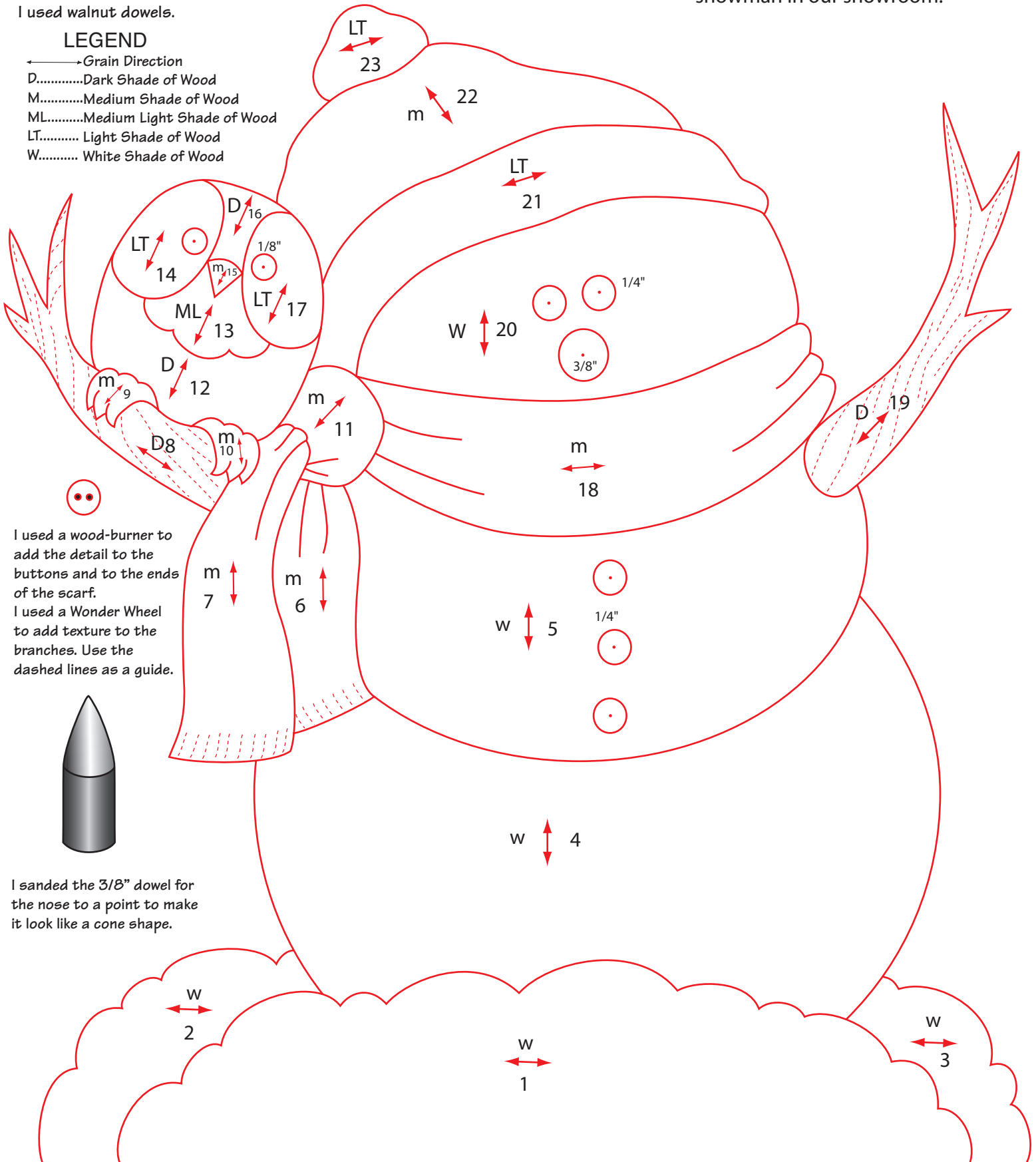
On this project I used aspen for the "W" areas, and western red cedar for all the different shades. Western red cedar has a wide variation of colors.

You will need 1/8", 1/4" and 3/8" dowels for the eyes, nose and buttons. I used walnut dowels.

- ← Grain Direction
- D.....Dark Shade of Wood
- M.....Medium Shade of Wood
- ML.....Medium Light Shade of Wood
- LT..... Light Shade of Wood
- W..... White Shade of Wood



I used a wood-burner to add the detail to the buttons and to the ends of the scarf. I used a Wonder Wheel to add texture to the branches. Use the dashed lines as a guide.



I sanded the 3/8" dowel for the nose to a point to make it look like a cone shape.
