## **Basic Installation**



**Installation** – Small to Medium sized decals, large with two people.

- 1. Place two pieces of tape on the transfer tape about <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> of the way up the sides.
- 2. Stick your tape corners in the desired location.
- 3. Using a tape measure or ruler make sure the decal is squared to the surface or to your specific dimensions. Start with the left-to-right measurements and then remove the tape that is stuck to a side and get one side measurement, followed by the other side until the decal is square.
- 4. Once square, use a grease pencil to mark the top corners of the paper. A couple pieces of tape could also be used to mark the corners.
- 5. Remove the two pieces of tape and flip your decal over.
- 6. Carefully peel the backing paper off your decal. The sticky side should be facing up now
- 7. Once removed spray the sticky side with application fluid and place the decal up to your marks.
- 8. Since using fluid the decal will have some slide, use this to your advantage while positioning.
- 9. After placing the decal use your squeegee to push the fluid out from underneath. Start from the middle and push up, then down. Use overlapping strokes to ensure that all fluid is removed.
- 10. The most important thing to do now is wait. Do not rush your decal, give it time to dry. If applying on glass make sure you give even more time to dry.
- 11. When ready to peel the transfer tape make sure you wet it with application fluid. This will help the tape release from the decal.
- 12. Start peeling in the top corner making sure you keep the angle as close to 0 degrees as possible. Peeling straight up runs the risk of pulling the decal with it.
- 13. With the transfer tape removed use your towel to dry any remaining fluid and wipe away the pencil marks.
- 14. If any air bubbles are visible then use your thumb to push the air into one spot and use your pin to poke a tiny hole to release the air.

Give the decal at least 24 hours away from the elements if possible. It is also strongly advised to not power wash your decals at anytime.

Take the extra time make sure your surface is clear of dirt and grease and your decals will not only look better they will last far longer.
