The main activities are focused on the production of architectural/cultural events (lectures, exhibitions, competitions, research/studies and community workshops, spatial interventions, projections etc.) through the international festival Days of Architecture Sarajevo, one of the most recognised architectural events in South-East Europe, held over multiple days annually since 2008.
