

Histories of Ukrainian Architecture

A Publishing Programme in Response to the Russian War of Aggression

Since its foundation in 2005, the Berlin-based DOM publishers have focused on architecture and urban design in East Europe and former Soviet Republics. Before 24 February 2022, close contacts with authors in Ukraine, Georgia, Belarus, Russia and elsewhere in this post-socialist context have helped to promote and cultivate academic exchange despite increasingly difficult conditions. To give Ukrainian authors a more excellent voice outside their homeland, to increase the knowledge about architectural history, and to strengthen Ukraine's sovereignty, the publishers launched the programme »Histories of Ukrainian Architecture« – a series of full-colour textbooks with richly-illustrated topics on architecture, urban design, planning methods, and architects' portraits in the past 100 years. These titles will be published in different languages (English, Ukrainian, and German) as part of DOM publishers' BASICS series. In addition, bilingual editions of Kyiv and Kharkiv (English and Ukrainian) are published in the internationally award-winning series of architectural guides. They complement previous titles on Slavutych and an edition on mosaics in public spaces and building façades. Part of the programme is published in cooperation with our Kyiv-based partner Osnovy Publishing.*

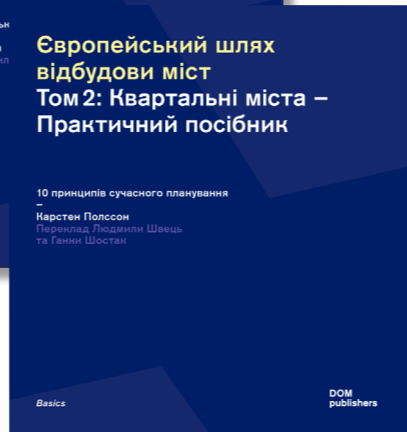
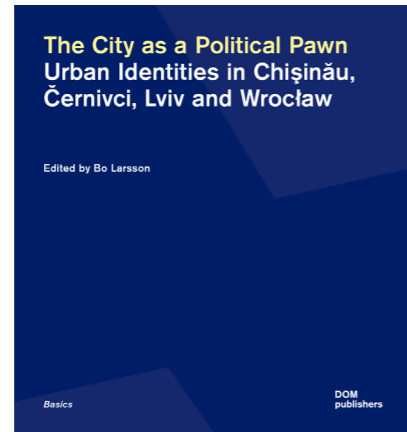

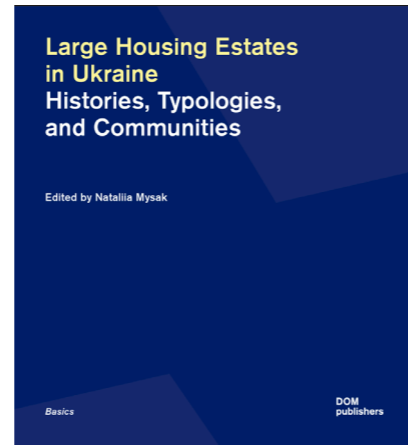
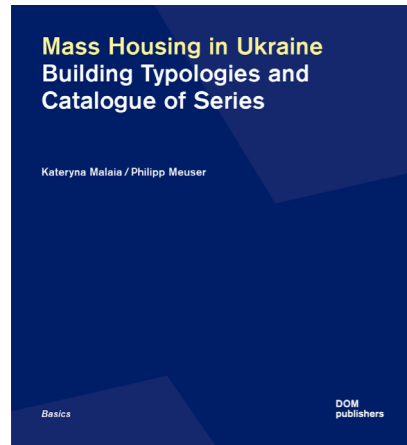
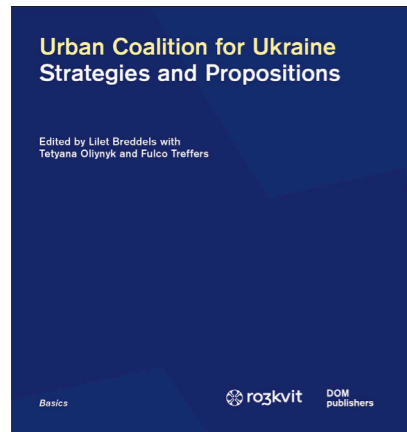
