IF THIS HAPPENS:	DO THIS:				
Tanker / vehicle Accident	Switch off engine and electrical equipment. Keep people away, warn other traffic. Check for spills or leaks. Keep away from: open flame, sparks and heat.  Call the emergency services: Dial 111				
Spill or leak	Remove ignition sources. Stop leak if safe to do so. Evacuate unprotected personnel. If possible contain the spill: Place inert absorbent, non-combustible material onto spillage. Dispose of waste according to the applicable local and national regulations.				
Fire	Call the fire Service: Dial 111. Fire decomposition products may be toxic if inhaled.  Total protection required including self-contained breathing apparatus in enclosed areas or in close proximity to fire.  Extinguishing media: Use foam, fine water spray and dry chemical powder.  Carbon dioxide, clean agents, sand or earth may be used for small fires only.				

## If swallowed Do not induce vomiting: transport to nearest medical facility for additional treatment. Wash out mouth and lips with water. If vomiting occurs spontaneously, keep head below hips to prevent aspiration. For advice contact The National Poisons Centre 0800 POISON (0800 764 766). If in eyes Hold eyelids apart and flush the eyes continuously with running water. Continue flushing for several minutes until all contaminants are washed out completely. Seek medical attention. If on skin Wash affected area thoroughly with soap and water. Remove contaminated clothing and wash before reuse or discard. If symptoms develop, seek medical attention. If inhaled Remove affected person from contaminated area. Keep at rest until recovered. If symptoms persist seek medical attention.
