



Care & Maintenance Instructions: Porcelain

For all cleaners and sealers, **ALWAYS** test a small area first and follow manufacturer's instructions and limitations.

Porcelain is highly durable, featuring low porosity and requiring minimal maintenance. Clean with a mild detergent or pH-neutral cleaner diluted in water. Avoid abrasive or acidic cleaners, and it's advisable to test any cleaners in a small area first. Elon recommends applying an impregnating or penetrating sealer on all Porcelain Tiles both before grouting, for easier installation cleanup, and after grouting as part of general maintenance to protect the grout. Follow these instructions to ensure your porcelain tiles maintain their optimal appearance.

Cleaning Porcelain

Use a pH-Neutral cleaner. When used regularly, it will prevent soap scum buildup and hard water deposits. Many concentrated stone and tile cleaners are good for Natural Stone, Ceramic, Porcelain, Grout, Quarry, Saltillo, Terra Cotta, Cement Pavers, Masonry surfaces.

Sealing Porcelain

Seal grout joints with a grout sealer or impregnating / penetrating sealer, be sure to remove all sealer residue from surface of tile to prevent product hazing.
