


### Cable Star

This stencil has lots of options for filling space! You can leave all the elements in or start taking certain lines out to completely change the look.


This gives you four different sizes of circles and five different sizes of stars that you can use for other designs.







This shows just the star medallion without the rope cable. Remember...you don't have to use all the lines...just the ones you want.


This shows just the rope cable without the medallion. You would need to fill in the blank spots. This can be easily done by rotating the stencil around and filling it in.






Remember I mentioned that all of these stencils were designed to work together??? The swag and the rope center are from Circle Medley #2.








#### Zig-Zag Circle


This stencil gives you five different sized circles as well as two zig zag circles all of which can be used together or separate!

The sample below also used the Zig-Zag Ultimate Border as well as the Baby Clams from the Ultimate Backgrounds.






Don't be afraid to "overlap" designs! I decided I wanted the zig-zag circle to go underneath the feathered star. This provides wonderful dimension and movement. I also removed the inside feathers from the star to give me more room to fill. This would be pretty filled with one of the circles from the Circle Medleys. Again...use the provided ink drawings to enlarge/shrink designs to make them fit. Use a light table to trace/transfer the designs to your quilt top.




## Feathered Star





I removed the inside feathers from the star and added the cable medallion to the inside. I added the Rope Cable from the Circle Medley behind the star.




## Circle Medley #1

The Circle and Oval Medley stencils are designed for you to pick and choose whichever designs you want. You can use just one, just a couple or even all of them!

I've included a few examples in this book of how they have been combined with other medallions.

# Circle Medley #2

Quilting instructions for these cables are on pages 22-26. Cable #2 instructions can be found on page 15.



The Circle Medley stencils are cut with only 1/4th of the design. There will be a marker in the corner of the stencil. This MUST be lined up with where you want the center of the design to be.

Line up the corner mark with the center of your quilt. Mark 1/4th of the design. Now rotate it, match up the stencil to the edge of your marked design and mark the next 1/4th of the design. Repeat until you have a full circle/oval.

If you don't line up at the center each time you will have a wonky circle. Be sure to NOT flip the stencil each time. Just rotate it.
