Testimonial for Australian Medical Sheepskin

While being treated for a heart condition, my mother developed a necrotic bed sore that unfortunately went undetected for four days, to the point it was black and had an odor. On the 5th day treatment was begun with the application of antibiotics and the typical bandaid meant for bed sores. The protocol is to label the bandaid with that day's date and I did observe that process. With that process the sore can go a fairly long time without being checked. I was told by the medical professionals that the bedsore bandage may not be changed unless it becomes soiled or wet from a bath for example.

When I learned of the coccyx bedsore sheepskin pad I decided to give it a try. I wasn't convinced until I started to see the rapid healing with my own eyes. I took a picture on the first day the doctor viewed it when starting antibiotics and then proceeded to photo document for the duration of mom's stay. The speed with which it healed was amazing. The sore healed in 2.5 months. The enormity of the sore and depth has left her with a permanent scar but it is definitely healed and she has gone without the sheepskin pad for quite awhile choosing to sit/lay on a sheepskin blanket (with clothing on) just in case the compromised skin breaks again. So far so good.

During the care in her home she became more weak and because she was so afraid to lay on the old sore, she developed a new bedsore on her right side. I was on top of it immediately and even though it was tiny, it was quite open and bled. Within 2 to 3 days using the sheepskin pad this new sore healed. A few days later there was a slight mark only.


I know Steve, you can explain why the sheepskin works. I can only tell you that it does. It is my understanding that it whisks away moisture and promotes sloughing which is exactly what you need to heal the wound. You want to promote tissue growth and remove fluids. The opposite happens with the products that are used where my mom was when diagnosed with the bedsore. Or should I say it takes much longer. At the onset of her very large bedsore I was told of a few scenarios for how long she would have to deal with the sore. They ranged from many months to over a year to never healing. Imagine my surprise seeing it heal so quickly. All thanks to the sheepskin pads!

And in closing I dare say that prevention would be exactly what our health care system should look at by using these sheepskin products. I bought a 6 pack of coccyx sheepskin pads and washed and used them over and over. These could be used for years. Prevention is less costly.

So very glad we had these pads as it was one less trauma my mother faced during her recuperation.
