



HOW TO CARE

How to keep

Keep in a place away from direct sunlight.

Wellies get sunburn!

To avoid colour distortions, it is better to store them away from direct sunlight.

After use in wet weather, removing any insoles will allow them to dry better.



How to polish

If your boots get dirty.



If white powdery marks appear on the surface, clean then with a wet cloth, or a commercially available silicon oil for shoes.

Wash up!

If you use your boots a lot, cleaning will return them to new.

What to use: a bucket, soapy water, a sponge, and a towel.



1. Take out any insoles in the boots
2. Place two litres of water, and a small amount of cleaning fluid into the bucket. If smells are a concern you can add an oxidised bleach too.

3. Wearing rubber gloves, clean the inner and outer of the boots with a sponge. You can clean the insoles at the same time.
4. Rinse around three times with water, and wipe away the excess water with a towel. Wipe the inner a few times extra for added assurance.

★After cleaning, as shown in the picture, place the boots in a place with good ventilation, and allow them to dry naturally.

Points for use

WBSJ rubber boots are suitable in many contexts, but as they use thin rubber, there are a couple of situations to be aware of.

- ◆ In places with many pointy grasses or rocks.
- ◆ Long distance walks.
- ◆ Extreme cold.



This may result in damage so be careful.



These will be more comfortable with a comfy insole.



Wear thick socks so you don't get cold.
