

Winter Sports 3 Part Cards




15 of the Winter Olympic sports are represented in this 3-part card set.

Category Sorting: Is this Good Sportsmanship?




Laminate and cut the cards. Use these as a jumping off point for a discussion on good sportsmanship.

Read the cards to the children and have them decide whether the behavior described shows good sportsmanship or not. 12 cards are provided.

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
Writing: Sports Report



Use these pages to record the medal winners for the various sports. Write the name of the country or the athlete on the dotted line. Use a flag identification book to draw a picture of the flag.


Flash cards of flags from some of the participating countries have been provided in this set as a reference. Note: Some sports do NOT have a black-line illustration.

Country Flags Flash Cards



These cards represent flags from 18 participating countries. These countries have received the most medals in the winter games since 1924.
