

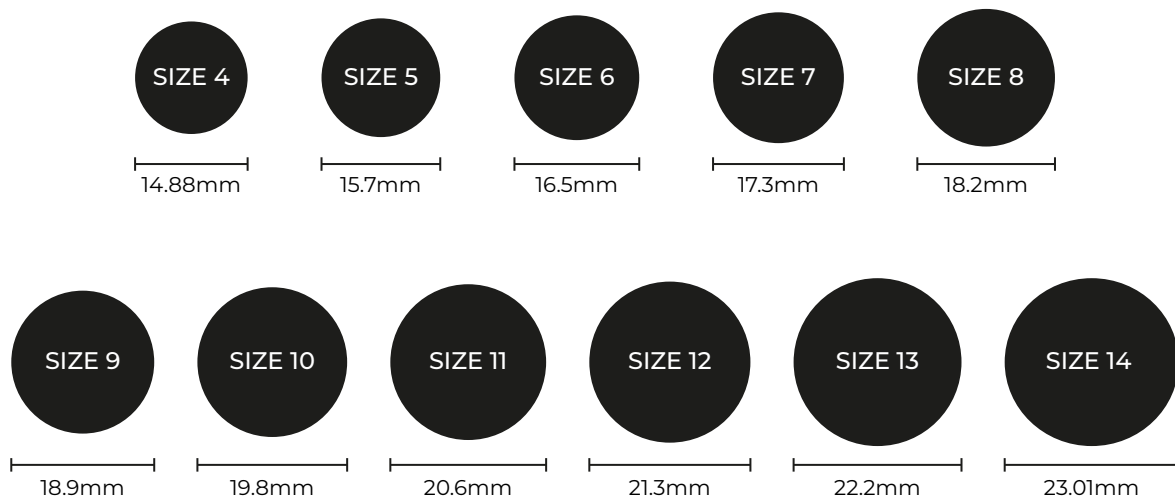


## SILICONE RING SIZING GUIDE



### To Print This Page

1. When you're printing this page, start by downloading this PDF file to your computer and making sure you're printing at 100%. That way, the ring sizer will be able to make accurate measurements.
2. If you're unsure how to check the print size: open up your printer dialogue box and look for the "scaling" settings. Make sure it's set at "none" or uncheck the box for page scaling.
3. Once printed, compare a ruler or a standard United State quarter to make sure the size is correct. Taking this extra step will ensure that your measurements are accurate.



### To Measure Your Ring

1. Find a ring that already fits comfortably. The ring should slide off your finger with relative ease but it shouldn't be so loose that it's able to fall off your finger accidentally.
2. Place your ring on the attached chart.
3. Match your ring to the circle that most closely resembles it. Ideally, you'll want the colored portion to fit within the diameter of the ring almost exactly.
4. You might find that your ring seems to fall between two sizes. If this is the case, then it is recommended that you go with the smaller size. So for example, if your ring is smaller than a size 8 but bigger than a size 7, you'd want to go with a size 7.
