


Monograms are a wonderful way to personalize your placemats and instantly elevate your table. Below, you'll find a few examples of different styles of monogram, and how you can use them to make your next gathering extra special.

Here, we will make a monogram for **Monica Elizabeth Geller** as an example.

For a personal monogram, there are two methods, depending on the style of type you are using.



When letters are all the same height, they go in order of the individual's initials.



When there is one larger middle letter, the last name goes in the center.

For a couple's monogram, there are two methods, and both are acceptable. Just be sure to choose a style and stick with it on all of your monogrammed goods!

Here, we will make a monogram for **Monica and Chandler Bing** as an example.



Some believe the groom's first and last name should not be separated, so having the groom's initial first is seen as more traditional, but both are fine!

For same sex couples, any order is acceptable, just be sure to use the same version consistently on all of your monogrammed goods.
