BBQ UTENSIL ROLL

Say goodbye to messy BBQ utensils all over the place! Create this fabric utensil roll that keeps things organized. Add a bit of personalization by adding a name or monogram! Not only is it practical, but it is also a great gift for your favorite Grill Master!

Skill Level: Beginner

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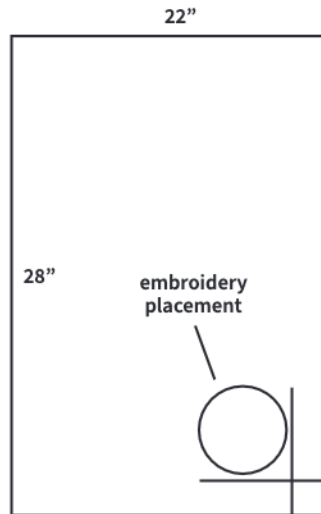
Supplies:

- Baby Lock Embroidery Machine
 - Embroidery Foot and 5x7 or 4x4 Hoop
- Baby Lock Sewing Machine
- 1 yard of cotton or canvas fabric for utensil roll exterior
 - Cut a 28" X 22" rectangle for top panel
 - Cut an 8" X 22" rectangle for pocket
- 1 yard of cotton or canvas fabric for roll lining
 - Cut a 28" X 22" rectangle for top panel
 - Cut an 8" X 22" rectangle for pocket
- Batting-Cut a 28" X 22"
- Optional- Pellon Vinyl Fuse for the lining
 - Teflon Foot
- 1 yard of 1" Twill Tape or ribbon for tie
- 1 yard of 1" elastic
- Madeira Rayon or Polyester Embroidery Thread
- Embroidery bobbin
- Baby Lock Tear-Away Stabilizer BLT104(cut for appropriate hoop)
- Madeira Sewing Thread
- Rotary cutter, ruler, and mat
- Wonder Clips or pins
- Chalk or marking pen
- Temporary spray adhesive
- Iron and iron mat



INSTRUCTIONS- UTENSIL ROLL EXTERIOR:

STEP 2:



1. Our first step is to add some personalization to the utensil roll.
2. To help in placement of our monogram or name, mark a line about 2" from the side and bottom on the bottom right corner of the exterior rectangle.

STEP 3:



3. Hoop the marked corner of the exterior fabric along with tear-away stabilizer.
4. Thread the machine with embroidery thread and bobbin.
5. Attach the hoop to the embroidery machine.
6. Select the letters from the built-in font and keep within a 3" x 3" design size.

STEP 7:



7. Layout the design as desired and place using the marked lines on the fabric and the move keys.

STEP 8:



8. Once placed, stitch out the design.
9. Remove the fabric from the hoop and tear away any excess.
10. Press if needed and set aside.

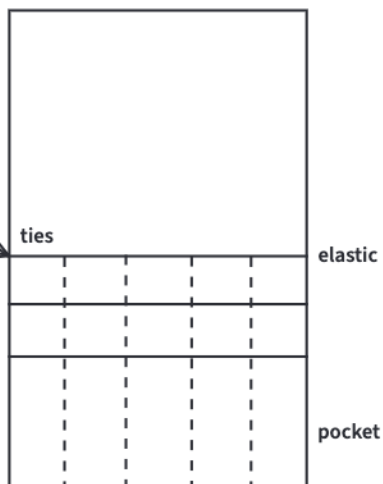
UTENSIL ROLL LINING:

STEP 2:



1. Take the two 8" X 22" rectangles and place them right sides together.
2. Clip or pin them together along one of the 22" sides of the rectangles.
3. Stitch ½" seam along the pinned edge.
4. Turn and press the stitched edge with wrong sides together.
5. Top stitch along the pressed edge.
6. Layer the pocket rectangle on the right side of the lining rectangle, aligning bottom raw edges.
7. Pin in place.
8. Optional-To seal the inside of the BBQ roll, the Pellon Vinyl Fuse can be applied prior to the following steps. Use a Teflon foot as needed with addition of the Vinyl Fuse.

STEP 9:



9. Using chalk or marking pen, mark vertical stitching lines at 3" intervals across the pocket rectangle. Extend the line about 4" above the pocket rectangle as well.

STEP 10:



10. At the sewing machine using sewing thread, straight stitch the marked stitching lines on the pocket rectangle, backstitching at the beginning and end of each line to secure the pocket.

STEP 11:



11. Place the piece of elastic across the rectangle 2" above the top of the pocket. Pin in place and stitch to secure at the same line intervals.

STEP 12:



12. Fold and stitch the ends of the yard of twill tape.

STEP 13:



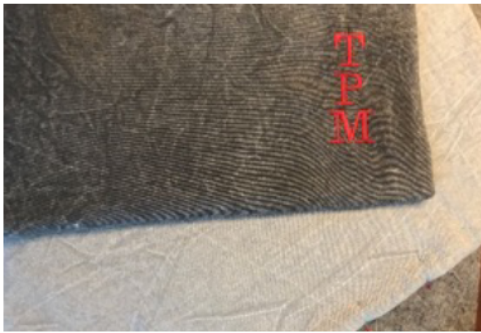
13. Fold the twill tie in half and place the tie on the left-hand edge and stitch at the same point as the elastic.

UTENSIL ROLL ASSEMBLY:

1. Place the pocketed lining unit right side up. Layer with the roll exterior layer wrong side up and batting. Be sure to have the embroidered corner aligned with the pocket end of the lining.
2. Clip or pin in place.
3. Sew edges in place using a $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance, being careful not to catch tie ends in stitching and leaving a 5" opening in the top edge for turning.
4. Turn the sewn roll right side out, trimming and pushing out corners.
5. Press the sewn utensil roll.
6. Top stitch $\frac{1}{8}$ " X $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the edges, sewing the opening closed to complete the utensil roll.
7. Place your clean BBQ Utensils in the slots, fold the top and wrap using the twill ties. Keep them safe and stored for the next cookout!
