Three very different people — a quantum physicist, a neuroscientist and an FBI agent — find themselves drawn into a spiraling mystery with no clear answers. Confronted with a bizarre car accident, the three must interpret clues that defy common sense. Their collective quest takes them from science to art to music to mysticism in a widening search for answers.

After an intense outward chase to satisfy their rational minds, the trio realizes the answers they desire are buried deep within themselves. Then the real mystery begins. As each seeker begins to embrace the true nature of reality, each is rewarded with revelations beyond their wildest imaginings.
