Our Carmelite saints all invite God-seekers to humility as essential to the spiritual journey. But we think they'd agree we can rightfully celebrate some special honors several ICS books and our authors have received in the past year:

The Catholic Press Association (CPA) of the United States and Canada presented its 2014 award for Best Book from a

Small Publisher/2nd place to Father Marc Foley's popular new book *The Ascent of Mount Carmel: Reflections* (p. 4) (While Father Marc is now serving as ICS publisher, he's promised to make time to keep writing, too. We hope to have an additional title of his to present in the year ahead.)

And in 2015 the CPA honored two new ICS books and their authors with additional awards in the same category: 2nd place to Father Mark O'Keefe's *Love Awakened by Love* mentioned above, and 3rd place to *Edith Stein: Letters to Roman Ingarden*. The 2015 5th centenary of St. Teresa's birth was a fitting time to acknowledge the lifetime work of ICS Publications' publisher emeritus, Father Kieran Kavanaugh. During the Carmelite

Symposium held in Mundelein, Ill., this past summer, Father Kieran was honored

with the presentation of the **Lifetime Achievement Award for his 50 years of work** that produced extensive academic contributions to the Carmelite Order and the whole church. Among his many accomplishments are the internationally acclaimed translations into English of the collected

works of St. Teresa of Avila and St. John of the Cross, several study editions of these works, and others in preparation.

In addition to a Eucharistic liturgy celebrated with several hundred participants and a festive banquet in his honor, Father Kieran was presented with a unique original icon of St. Teresa of Jesus written by Sister Mary Grace Melcher of the Carmel of Terre Haute, Ind.


Of all St. Teresa's works, *The Book of Foundations* is the least read, the least quoted, and the least known. This may be because people do not think of it as a “spiritual” book.
