Watkins Sibling Series Langhorne Creek Grenache 2022



The Watkins family entered the wine industry in 1997 when David and Ros Watkins planted their first vineyard in South Australia. In 2019, David and Ros brought their children into the fold: Sam Watkins as Winemaking Director, Ben Watkins at Commercial Director and Jo Watkins as Export, Sales and Marketing Director. Together the Watkins family own and operate a winery and vineyard (8ha) in Clarendon, Adelaide Hills and a vineyard in Langhorne Creek (141ha). There was an opportunity to start selling their premium wine from these vineyards directly to consumers, which saw the start of the Watkins label. Sam Watkins, as the winemaker, has spent over 15 years training and refining his palate. Sam has undertaken vintages in well-known wine regions across the world including the Napa Valley in the USA and the Duoro Valley in Portugal.

Tasting Notes

Elegantly perfumed with dark cherry, violet, olive and subtle spice aromas, followed by a juicy palate delivering fleshy texture and fine, mellow tannins. Silky and flowing to a lengthy velvety finish.

Idle Hill Shiraz 2021

One of the largest landholders in the Barossa, Grant Burge wines is a bastion of well made, value for money wines. Drawing on their depth of experience in the region, Grant Burge and his wife Helen established the brand in 1988 and have developed a formidable range of wines across a broad spectrum of price points. The history of the Burge family and their long association with winemaking in the region can be traced back to March 1855, when noted tailor John Burge immigrated to the Barossa from Hillcot, near Pewsey in Wiltshire, England with his wife Eliza and their two sons.

Tasting Notes

Oak is immediately present on the nose. Rounded vanillan oak characters continue on the palate, harmonising with pleasant charry tannins, savoury leather notes and red fruit characters.

Reschke R Series Malbec 2022

The Reschke family first settled in Coonawarra in 1906, where they established their Hereford stud. The cattle grazing heritage is the inspiration for the Bull logo and hopefully symbolises their 'grit' in pursuit of their goals, passion, strength and resolve. The Reschke vineyard holdings of 400 acres, consists of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot, Shiraz, Petit Verdot, all cropped particularly low to yield the highest quality fruit. The generation of Coonawarra that Reschke represents is two fold, with cutting edge viticulture married to traditional wine making techniques under the watchful eye of winemaking legend, Peter Douglas.

Tasting Notes

Aromas of violet perfume with complex rich red black fruit flavours. Enhanced with fragrant spice and oak, the medium bodied wine is a complex easy drinking style that is ready for immediate enjoyment.

Tertini Pinot Blanc 2021

When Julian Tertini began the development of Tertini Wines in 2000, he followed in the footsteps of Joseph Vogt 145 years earlier. History does not relate the degree of success that Joseph had, but the site he chose then was, as it is now, a good one. Tertini has Pinot Noir and Riesling (1.8ha each), Cabernet Sauvignon and Chardonnay (1ha each), Arneis (0.9ha), Pinot Gris (0.8ha), Merlot (0.4ha) and Lagrein (0.2ha). Winemaker Jonathan Holgate, who is responsible for the outstanding results achieved at Tertini, presides over High Range Vintners, a contract winemaking business also owned by Julian Tertini.

Tasting Notes

Citrus and green apple dominate the aromas with subtle chalkiness. These characters flow onto the palate with a fine texture contributed from its 5 months maturing on lees. Crisp acidity gives it length and liveliness.

Tasting Notes

Elegant nose of crunchy apple, grapefruit, nougat and roasted cashew, leading to a creamy, textured palate of juicy fruit flavours, backed by bright acidity. Delightfully restrained and harmonious with a long linear finish.
