Laurent Perrachon Morgon Côte du Py 2021

The emblematic and historic family estate of Laurent Perrachon is one of the leading luminaries driving the renaissance of the region and have been courted by some of the world's leading wine importers and wholesalers, particularly in the US and Europe. Using classic, goblet-trained, old-vine

material from some of the leading climates, Perrachon make dynamic, organic, terroir-driven wines that seem to have more in common with the great estates of Burgundy, than they do with Beaujolais itself. They are intensely cerebral wines that will have you coming back for more.

Tasting Notes

Intense color, ambitious, long lasting aromas. Hints of kirsch, peppery notes, ideal for rich meals with complex flavors.

Yelland & Papps Barossa Valley Second Take Mataro 2020

Yelland & Papps is a 1st generation husband and wife team starting in 2005 in the iconic Barossa Valley, using a minimal intervention approach to create elegant, structured fruit-forward wines to enjoy in a social aspect or can cellar gracefully for many years to come. In the winery there a focus on using a lot of whole bunch fermentation, no filtration, larger format oak and putting 100% whole bunches in puncheons and

letting them sit for up to a year in some cases. All wines are wild fermented, unfinned, vegan friendly and unfiltered with only a couple whites being filtered. Their wines showcase fruit as the hero and using a lighter touch with fine grain oak, make wines that are delicate and elegant. Using minimal inputs during the winemaking process to allow the fruit to speak in a clear voice, uncluttered by overzealous oak and a heavy hand.

Tasting Notes

A bouquet of violet aromas makes way for a rich palate of dark cherries, chocolate and Asian spice. Aging will be high rewarding, resulting in aniseed and hoisin characteristics along with blue fruit and cedar notes.

Tascante Etna Rosso 2017

Tasca d'Almerita's history in Sicily is written in the land that they have cared for over eight generations. Since first plantings in 1830, Tasca d'Almerita have established five different estates in Sicily – Regaleali, Capofaro, Tascante,

Whitaker and Sallier de La Tour – each with its own characteristics. The Tascante estate was established in 2007 with its vineyard on the highest volcano in Europe, Mount Etna. A force of nature in its primordial state.

Tasting Notes

Deep red. Very flinty and pure aromas of red cherry, redcurrants, and herbs. Then mineral with juicy acidity and plenty of youthful vibrancy to the floral flavors. A lovely Etna Rosso that finishes long and graceful.

Domaine Baud L'Etoile Chardonnay 2019

The estate history dates back to 1742, when Jean-François Baud started working as a pieceworker in Le Vernois. In 1950, René Baud, the 7th generation, rebuilt the vineyard which had suffered from the phylloxera crisis as well as the two World Wars. At that time, 4 hectares of vines were cultivated. In 1978, the 8th generation started running the winery (Jean Michel Baud and Alain Baud), and gave the company a fresh boost by

creating the official estate GAEC Baud Père et Fils. Thanks to their hard work, the vineyard was progressively extended from 4 to 20 hectares of vines. It is currently their pride, namely to have experienced 38 harvests! Jean Michel Baud was in charge of the vineyard, as for his brother, Alain Baud, was responsible for wine-making and trade.

Tasting Notes

Aromas of butter poached pears spiced with nutmeg, clove and cardamom. Palate is beautifully balanced in the mouth. Full bodied, yet fresh and with vibrant acidity. Flavors of lightly-spiced poached pear and lemon peel.

Bethany Blue Quarry Eden Valley Riesling 2021

In 1981, fifth generation brothers Robert and Geoff established Bethany Wines. They built a winery in the quarry where the early pioneers had hewn stone for their homes. They crushed 2 tonnes of Shiraz and Riesling, launching the next chapter of the Schrapel wine story. The early 1980s were tough for Barossa grape growers. A glut followed a red wine boom and grape prices fell below production cost. The State Government wanted growers to pull out old Shiraz and Grenache vines. They encouraged growers to plant new

varieties or leave the industry. Fortunately, the brothers chose to establish a tradition of winemaking from this undervalued yet irreplaceable resource of old vineyards. Almost 40 years on they are a vibrant family company that plays a significant role in the Barossa community. Tania Schrapel continues the legacy of the business, sharing the same passion for the vineyards, for crafting fine wines, and for the future working alongside her father, Geoff and Uncle, Robert.

Tasting Notes

Full and focused nose of wet stones, wisteria, cut limes and bedsheets dried outdoors. The palate is super tight with notes of lime skin, granny smith apples, elderflower, carried by a crisp, gentle acidity.
