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

## **Domaine Baud** L'Etoile Chardonnay 2019

The estate history dates back to 1742, when Jean-François Baud started working as a pieceworker in Le Vernois. In 1950, René Baud, the 7th generation, rebuilt the vineyard which had suffered from the phylloxera crisis as well as the two World Wars. At that time, 4 hectares of vines were cultivated. In 1978, the 8th generation started running the winery (Jean Michel Baud and Alain Baud), and gave the company a fresh boost by creating the official estate GAEC Baud Père et Fils. Thanks to their hard work, the vineyard was progressively extended from 4 to 20 hectares of vines. It is currently their pride, namely to have experienced 38 harvests! Jean Michel Baud was in charge of the vineyard, as for his brother, Alain Baud, was responsible for wine-making and trade.

#### **Tasting Notes**

Aromas of butter poached pears spiced with nutmeg, clove and cardamom. Palate is beautifully balanced in the mouth. Full bodied, yet fresh and with vibrant acidity. Flavors of lightly-spiced poached pear and lemon peel.

# **Bethany Blue Quarry Eden Valley Riesling 2021**

In 1981, fifth generation brothers Robert and Geoff established Bethany Wines. They built a winery in the quarry where the early pioneers had hewn stone for their homes. They crushed 2 tonnes of Shiraz and Riesling, launching the next chapter of the Schrapel wine story. The early 1980s were tough for Barossa grape growers. A glut followed a red wine boom and grape prices fell below production cost. The State Government wanted growers to pull out old Shiraz and Grenache vines. They encouraged growers to plant new

varieties or leave the industry. Fortunately, the brothers chose to establish a tradition of winemaking from this undervalued yet irreplaceable resource of old vineyards. Almost 40 years on they are a vibrant family company that plays a significant role in the Barossa community. Tania Schrapel continues the legacy of the business, sharing the same passion for the vineyards, for crafting fine wines, and for the future working alongside her father, Geoff and Uncle, Robert.

#### **Tasting Notes**

Full and focused nose of wet stones, wisteria, cut limes and bedsheets dried outdoors. The palate is super tight with notes of lime skin, granny smith apples, elderflower, carried by a crisp, gentle acidity.

## Terra Verde Tasmanian Chardonnay 2018

Tasmanian Vintners believe in the provenance and unique qualities of Tasmania, its people and its produce. They source the best fruit from vineyards that highlight the terroir and regionality of Tasmania to make wines under the direction of highly acclaimed winemaker Liam McElhinney.

Their vision is to champion Tasmanian wine, expanding to include their own vineyards and additional brands and to be recognised as one of the best producers of fine wine, just as their team have done in other wine regions.

#### **Tasting Notes**

Expressive perfume of baked apples, ripe stone fruit and almond cream with light vanilla and spice notes. The soft, creamy, textured palate displays vibrant citrus, hazelnut and ripe white nectarine with hints of flint.

## **Longview Vinevard** 'Macclesfield' Chardonnay 2020

Longview is a stunning, family-owned Adelaide Hills single vineyard located just outside the historic township of Macclesfield. Set on undulating slopes reminiscent of old world estates but with a clear Australian accent, it has quickly established itself as one of the most awarded vineyards in the region since its first vintage in 2001. Operations are overseen

by brothers Mark and Peter Saturno, along with a small but specialised team. They ensure the vineyard is fastidiously managed to produce the finest fruit for their premium estate grown wines and provide a wine tourism experience that has placed Longview in the South Australian Tourism Hall of Fame.

#### **Tasting Notes**

Tropical fruit aromas with a nutty honey complexity and a touch of ginger. The luscious palate features a well-integrated harmony of butterscotch, peach, brine, driven by hazelnut oak influence.

## Tyrrell's Steven Single Vineyard Semillon 2016

Tyrrell's is an iconic Hunter Valley winery renowned for producing some of Australia's greatest wines. Tyrrell's was established by English immigrant, Edward Tyrrell in 1858 at the foot of New South Wales' striking Brokenback Range. Today, Tyrrell's is headed up by 4th generation winemaker,

Bruce Tyrrell, with the 5th generation hot on his heels! Tyrrell's produces a broad array of wine varieties and styles, ranging from the inexpensive to the luxurious. They have championed the Semillon variety, with their flagship, of course, being the world-renowned Vat 1.

#### **Tasting Notes**

The hallmark of this vineyard is always the intense citrus lift with its almost Riesling-like mineral edge. The palate is tightly bound with a light, elegant, and impeccably long fruit profile.

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### **Peter Lehmann Cellar Archives** Barossa Semillon 2013

In 1979 Peter Lehmann parted ways with Saltram to start Masterson Wines, the company which has since evolved into Peter Lehmann Wines, in a move solely designed to help the growers he had built relationships with over the years. Peter took the surplus grapes and doing business on a handshake sold wine on a "pay now and we'll deliver in two years" arrangement called 'The Futures'. This raised enough money to buy the growers' fruit and process it into what became the first ever vintage of Peter Lehmann wine in 1980. Today the team at Peter Lehmann have a collective winemaking mentality defined by former chief winemaker and mentor, Andrew Wigan. Over the years there has been a natural evolution within the team but the approach has remained the same; consistency and a continuous strive for perfection.

#### **Tasting Notes**

The nose exhibits a hint of development with toast and brioche notes. The palate has both the typical zesty, citrus flavours of a young Semillon and the beeswax, honey complexities of its age.
