



## **2015 Two Vintners Lola – Walla Walla Valley** **60% Syrah 40% Cabernet Sauvignon**

**Tasting Notes** – Friendly, attention seeking and slightly funky smelling, just like her namesake (the winery dog) this wine is always a crowd pleaser. With big Cabernet fruits swirled with funky Walla Walla Rock’s Syrah how could you turn it down?

*94 pts Jeb Dunnuck – “The Syrah/Cab blend of the estate is the 2015 Lola, a 60/40 Syrah and Cabernet Sauvignon blend that spent 18 months in neutral barrels. Sporting a vibrant purple color as well as rocking notes of crème de cassis, blackberries, graphite, and lead pencil, it hits the palate with full-bodied richness, a rich, elegant texture, and fine, polished tannin. It’s a gorgeous wine.”*

### **Vineyards**

**Yellow Jacket Vineyard - Walla Walla AVA - Syrah** - Planted by Tom Waliser in the famous Milton-Freewater cobblestones in 2001 and covers 7.5 acres.

**Pepper Bridge Vineyard - Walla Walla AVA –Cabernet Sauvignon** - First planted in 1991 by Norm McKibben, PepperBridge Vineyard is one of Walla Walla’s most iconic vineyards. A cool site, Pepper Bridge produces dark muscular fruit with substantial structure.

**Stoney Vine Vineyard – Walla Walla AVA – Syrah** – Right down the street from Yellow Jacket Vineyard, similar soil composition but without cover crop. Planted in 2007 by Dusted Valley winery.

**Winemaking-** Fermented in open top, one ton bins and punched down 2-3 times daily for two weeks. Aged in a combination of neutral French Oak puncheons and barriques for 18 months.

**180 cases produced- Released February 2018.**
