Hi Quilting Friend!

Here's the Sewing Guide to Sewing a Log Cabin Quilt Block.

When making Log Cabin blocks, you typically begin with a square and then add strips around it. Usually, the two sides of the strips are lighter fabrics, while the other two are darker prints. **Traditionally, a red center square symbolizes the home's hearth,** while a yellow center represents light shining through the window.

If you're a beginner quilter, you'll love this versatile quilting block that's easy to make with the rotary method. You can use autumnal prints for a traditional, folksy look or go for a modern and breezy feel with different fabrics and colors.

To create this block, simply add 2 1/2" strips to the center square.

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What to do first:

Step 1) Read the pattern provided entirely

Step 2) Gather your fabrics

Step 3) Cut out your fabrics

Step 4) Sew your Fabrics

Step 5) Post your finished Quilt Block on the (free) Facebook Group - Quilting your Legacy Monthly Challenge

Gather your Fabrics:

- 1. A Center square 5" x 5"
- 2. B 1 2 1/2 x 28" strip
- 3. C 1 2 1/2 x 8" strip
- 4. D 1 2 1/2 x 24" strip
- 5. E 1 2 1/2 x 24" strip

% How to Cut:

Rotary method - 1/4" seam allowance

A Fabric:

Cut 1 - $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle Cut 1 - $12\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle

B & C Fabric:

Cut 1 - 6 1/2" x 21/2" rectangles

D & E Fabric:

- Cut 1 $8\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle Cut 1 - $10\frac{1}{2}$ " × $2\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangle
- F Fabric:
 - Cut 1 4½" square

<u>_</u>	How to Sew:
	 1. Sew Fabric A to the right side of the fabric F square (press seams going away from the center fabric.)
	\square 2. Then, sew Fabric B to the bottom of the Fabrics A and F unit. \square (Press seams away from the center fabric.)
	3. Next, sew Fabric C to the left edge of fabrics A, B, and F unit. (Press seams away from the center fabric.)
	4. Then, to finish the first set of strips, attach the smaller D-shaped fabric to the upper edge of units A, B, C, and F by sewing them together. (Press seams away from the center fabric.)
	5. Next, sew the shorter fabric E rectangle to the right edge of the fabrics A, B, C., D, and F units. (Press seams away from the center fabric.)
	6. Then, sew the second fabric D rectangle to the bottom edge. (Press seams away from the center fabric.)
	7. Next, sew the second fabric E rectangle to the left edge. (Press seams away from the center fabric and give it one final pressing.)
	8. To finish the block, sew the second fabric A to the top edge and press the seam outward.
