

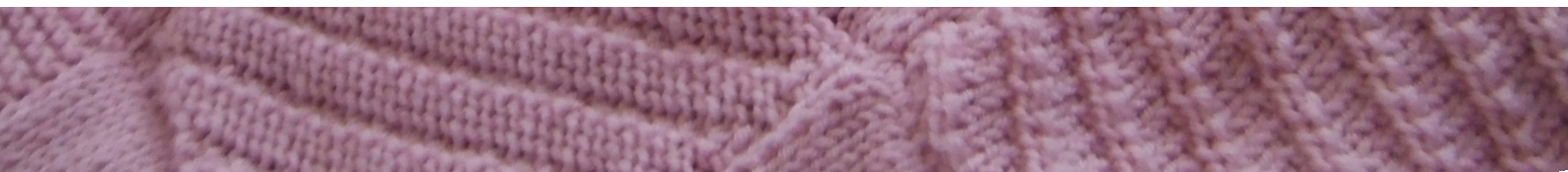

## FUN PATCH

NATURAL KNITTING





## MATERIALS:

- Needles – 4 mm
- Crochet Hook – 5 mm
- DMC Woolly merino wool



Cherry Red 488.052 – 10 balls



Dusty Pink 488.041 – 20 balls

**TENSION:** 22 stitches x 30 rows = 10cm

## TO BEGIN

Cast on 24 stitches, and begin knitting the heart - knit until square measure 10cm. Please pay attention to your knitting and tension. All squares measure 10x10cm.

## DIAGRAM

If you prefer a plain throw - you just follow the diagram, which describes how many squares you need of each pattern/texture. Many of the textures we have used are basic knitting techniques that is quite simple and many experienced knitters would know most of them. However, for beginners we have included a photo selection for each pattern together with a separate page with all the instructions. This page could be useful in the future for other projects - and you will also find that this 'library of stitches' will be used in other of our patterns this season.

## KNIT IMAGES

Here you can view how the pattern will look to make sure you have done the pattern correct. However, you might out of this even come up with a new interesting stitch (in case something goes wrong, oooops!) - so play & have fun!

## DESIGNS

Should you decide to play with colour & patterns from the squares - we have included 5 different options. However, you might come up with your own design using this simple technique.

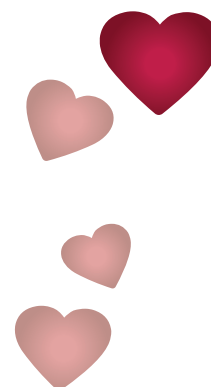
Each design explains how many squares you need of each colour and when done you just lay out all the squares after the diagram and stitch them together. Remember, you will still knit each square in a texture following the diagram - this will create a bit more volume and 3D effect in your finished throw!

## PRESENTATION

Once you have sewn your squares together (some prefer to use crochet instead) you might want to 'block' your work. Use a damp tea towel and press lightly with a warm iron (not hot!) and use the steam to 'form' your throw.

Only use this option if you feel your throw has gone a bit uneven.

Now it's time for a nice edging around the throw. Simply crochet two rounds of single crochet with the ground colour of the throw. To add extra touch and a classic twist to your throw - stitch with your choice of contrast colour some nice blanket stitch around the crochet edge.

X = stocking stitch (front up) x 97

1 = garter stitch x 9

2 = moss stitch x 35

3 = double moss x 9

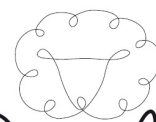
4 = diagonal back up x 9

5 = pike x 9

6 = basket knit x 9

7 = diagonal front up x 9

8 = broken ribb x 9

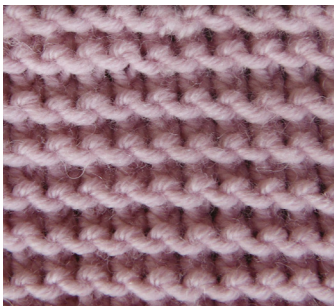


## **X stocking stitch** (front up)

Row 1 (the right side) knit.

Row 2 (the wrong side) purl.

Repeat rows 1 and 2.



## **1. GARTER STITCH:**

Knit all rows.



## **2. SEED/MOSS STITCH:**

Row 1 (the right side): knit 1 stitch, purl 1 stitch

Row 2 (the wrong side): purl over knitted stitch, knit over purled stitch



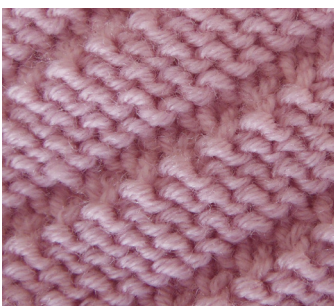
## **3.DOUBLE SEED/MOSS STITCH:**

Row 1 (the right side): knit 1 stitch, purl 1 stitch

Row 2 (the wrong side): knit over knitted stitch, purl over purled stitch

Row 3 (the right side): purl over knitted stitch, knit over purled stitch

Row 4 (the wrong side): knit over knitted stitch, purl over purled stitch



## **4. DIAGONAL** - back up

Row 1: Knit 5 - purl 2

Row 2: Knit on knit - purl on purl

Row 3: Knit 6 - purl 2, knit 5 - purl 2 (this means 1 stitch will be pushed forward and create a diagonal pattern)

Row 4: Knit on knit - purl on purl

Continue these rows, pushing 1 stitch forward.



## 5. PIKE

Row 1: \* Knit 3, purl 1\* repeat  
Row 2: Purl  
Row 3: Knit  
Row 4: Purl  
Row 5: Knit 1 \*purl 1, knit 3\* repeat  
until last 3 stitches, purl 1, knit 2.  
Row 6: Purl  
Row 7: Knit



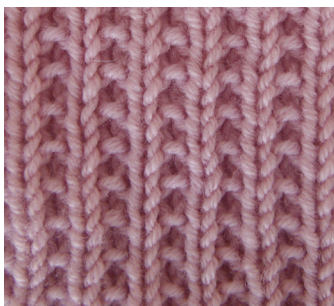
## 6. BASKET KNIT

Row 1: (front) knit  
Row 2: knit 5, purl 3  
Row 3: purl 5, knit 3  
Row 4: as row 2  
Row 5: knit  
Row 6: knit 5, purl 3  
Row 7: purl 5, knit 3  
Row 8: as row 6



## 7. DIAGONAL FRONT UP

Same pattern as No. 4 - front up



## 8. BROKEN RIBB

Row 1: (front) Knit  
Row 2: Knit 1, purl 1  
Continue these 2 rows
