Job Specification – Production Operator/ Packer for RATIO (updated March 2021)

Ratio produces plastic model kits and scenic items for the model railway hobby. It is part of the successful PECO group of companies whose head office and main factory is based in Beer, near Seaton. Peco was founded in 1946, is family owned and has gained a fine reputation for producing highly detailed and accurate model kits. Peco employs approx 120 staff across both sites (see www.peco-uk.com).

The operation at Ratio provides work for a small team of eight staff. The role of a production operator is to collate the plastic mouldings, sort them into sets, and pack them into the correct kits, along with any instructions and miscellaneous items. Staff are to take turns either packing or taking mouldings off the various machines.

Main purpose of Job:	To pack plastic model railway kits and associated products for shipment to Peco. Peco collects finished goods once a week as all orders are dispatched from Peco in Beer. The orders go all around the world.

Pay:
