

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SLIP-IN EASEL

NOTE: These images show the 9x12 Slip-In Easel in the 9x12 Guerrilla Box™. The directions here apply to all sizes of Slip-In Easels and their corresponding pochade boxes.






The Slip-In Easel will add flexibility to your Guerrilla Painter™ Pochade Box. With it you can:


- Position panels up and out from the box lid.
- Hold panels larger or smaller than your box size while you're painting.

If you are using your Slip-In Easel with the 9x12 Guerrilla Box™ we suggest that you use the Panel Clips that came with your box. This will allow you to keep the Slip-In Easel in the front of the lid, while allowing you to store panels in the slot behind.

The Slip-In Easel comes with two aluminum rods that slide into the corrugations (**A**). The aluminum rods are held in place by friction. If you find that the rods slide too hard (or too easy), you can adjust this easily with a pair of pliers, as show (**B**).

The Slip-In Easel can be used in two different orientations. With the shelf in the lower position (**C**), larger panels can be accommodated. Rotate the Slip-In Easel 180° to use in the upper position (**D**) when working with smaller panels.
