Treat yourself to a weekend discovering the extraordinary creativity of our guest artist *Helen King*. Come alone or with your friends to enjoy this weekend retreat on beautiful Macleay Island in the company of like-minded creatives following Helen's lead to produce your own version of her exquisite floral pieces using applique and surface work.





A LITTLE ABOUT HELEN

Based on the Sunshine Coast, Helen's art work combines elements of fabric applique, slow stitching and hand embroidery, enhanced with 'made up' loops and scoops from threads, string and twine.

She imagines an artist 'painting' with threads as she creates. Helen works instinctively from her imagination. Using extensive intricate thread work and stitches, she layers, embellishes, and enhances her applique pieces. Always fascinated by and keen to emulate the beautiful shapes of intertwining vines and leaves, she experiments and explores to great effect. She describes her work as a 'creative joy'.

Helen enjoys the freedom of working without a pattern, or rules and constraints.

Ever evolving and discovering, she continues to dream and develop and be true to her own creative style.





OUR RETREAT THEME Fabulous Floral Flourishes

Using Helen's techniques create your own wall hanging. Stitchers of all abilities will feel comfortable because you can achieve a gorgeous result using the simplest of stitches or embroidering to your heart's content.

Be inspired by examples of Helen's beautiful work. Under her guidance, you will learn how to compose an arrangement, discover new skills and indulge in the beautiful world of floral fabric joy.



WHAT IS INCLUDED?

Your weekend retreat cost is \$475 inclusive of:

- Pickup from Macleay Island Ferry Terminal
- Transfers across the weekend
- All meals, snacks and drinks
- 2 days instruction by Helen King

Colour Streams will also provide:

- A hand dyed background linen piece 55 x 40cms
- A small piece of contrasting hand dyed linen for the vase shape 25 x 25cms
- 5 skeins of Rana threads chosen by you to compliment the floral fabric
- 2 x packets of Stamens
- DMC Cotton Perle 10g Ecru (to stitch on the flowers and leaves)
- Size 18 Chenille Needles
- Large eye wool needle (for the stems of flowers.)

You will need to provide:

- Small pieces of floral fabric with favourite flowers and leaves, (to cut out). What ever you would like to include on your wall hanging. Shelley Burton from **The Fabric and Felt Studio** at Gumdale will be bringing a selection of Anna Maria Horner fabrics to Colour Streams for your selection (available at \$26.95 per metre). (For best effect, the flowers and leaves should be of various sizes and colours as realistic as possible neither flat nor stylised.) Feel free to bring any favourite pieces of floral fabric from home!
- Tacking cotton natural colour
- 4.5 cm marking pins
- Pin cushion
- Stitch picker
- Approx. 14.5cm sharp embroidery scissors
- Tweezers
- 19cm embroidery hoop (optional). These will be available for purchase from Colour Streams for \$7

Colour Streams will also extend a 10% discount to you for any other purchases made throughout the retreat.

ABOUT THE REDLANDS COAST

The Redlands Coast is perfectly positioned along picturesque Southern Moreton Bay, between Brisbane and the Gold Coast.Less than 30km from Brisbane, Redland City is a popular tourist destination and gateway to Brisbane's aquatic playground, the Moreton Bay Marine Park.This nature lover's paradise boasts 330km of coastline, tranquil islands, pristine beaches and peaceful hinterland, wrapped in sunshine 280 days a year.Redland City also has vibrant business districts, modern shopping centres, hundreds of restaurants and plenty of entertainment.

The indigenous Quandamooka people are believed to have been living in the Moreton Bay area for at least 20,000 years. They are the traditional owners and proud custodians of the lands and waters in much of the region today known as the Redlands. The annual Quandamooka festival from July to September is a unique opportunity to learn about the Redlands and Moreton Bay from the Quandamooka people's experience.

The islands of Southern Moreton Bay have been the home of the Nunukul and Gorenpul indigenous tribes for hundreds of centuries. The first known European to set foot on the Bay Islands was the English navigator Captain Matthew Flinders in 1799. After a penal settlement was established in 1824, convicts were harvesting timber on the islands for the next two decades. In 1842, the Moreton Bay district was opened to free settlement, and the islands continued to supply timber to the mills on the mainland. Oysters, produce and cattle farming were other business activities pursued until the 1950's.

ABOUT MACLEAY ISLAND

Macleay Island is the second largest of the Bay Islands. Macleay Island is sheltered in the vast marine park of Moreton Bay. It is rich in native flora and fauna, edged with mangrove foreshores and sandy beaches, providing respite from the outside world. An eco-tourism dream, the island offers a variety of experiences.

The island is a bird paradise, home to more than 200 species.

The calm waters are great for swimming, fishing, sea kayaking and snorkeling. Mingle with the locals playing golf, lawn bowls or tennis, explore the bicycle and heritage trails. Watch the dolphins, turtles, dugongs or go for beach walks.

Macleay Island seems to incite a creative inspiration that has drawn hundreds of artists to live and work on the island, some of whom are quite established and recognised nationally and internationally. The Arts Complex gallery is open to the public daily
