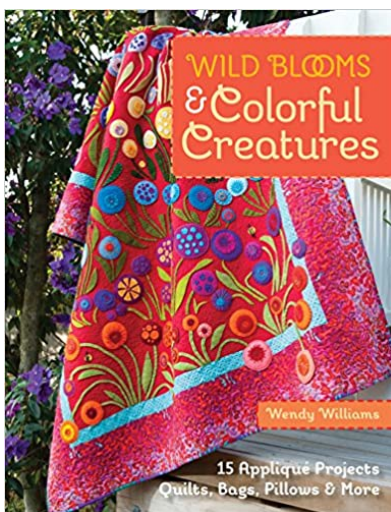
Having a degree in adult education has led her to teaching all over Australia and internationally.

Prior to working in the quilting industry, Wendy worked and taught in Fashion.

Wendy is passionate about quilting and trying new ideas. She strives to keep her designs fresh and new and designed with the knowledge that her patterns need to be achievable by all.

A variety of techniques are incorporated into the quilts and patterns she designs including wool applique. Her wool applique is usually done with pure wool felt using bold but simple embroidery stitches.

Wendy's aim is that her work is achievable for all levels of quilters and stitchers.





WHAT IS INCLUDED?

YOUR WEEKEND ITINERARY

Wednesday 14th September

Staging Place - **Redland Bay Marina** - Banana Street, Redland Bay

The public transport to Redland Bay is excellent and very simple - please refer to the Translink Journey Planner.

If you are driving and wish to park for the following two days, please contact us to help you arrange it.

We would love it if you could arrive in time for the **2.40pm ferry to Macleay Island** - it only takes 20 minutes and leaves from the end bay of the terminal (Platform 4). Remember to grab yourself a GO Card if you are local to SE QLD or your credit/debit card if you don't have a GO Card - they don't take cash! (The ferry cost will be around \$7 - although cheaper with Concession Cards, etc.)

This ferry will get you to Macleay Island at 2.58pm and we will be there to greet you.

3pm

Arrive Macleay Island Ferry Terminal.

Pick up by Colour Streams for a short tour of the island (we are only 6 x 4kms after all and home to over 150 artists!) then straight to your accommodation to settle in for the weekend.

6pm

Pick up from your accommodation for drinks at the Colour Stream's studio whilst you select your stitching goodies for your weekend of stitching. Wendy will be there to guide you in your selections!

Then enjoy dinner to celebrate the beginning of our two days together after which we will return you to your accommodation.

Thursday 15th September

8.10 - 8.30am

Pick up from your accommodation and settle in at Paloma, 53 Attunga Street which will be our base for the next two days. We will have a supply of fabrics and threads in case you feel the need for further supplies.

8.30am

Buffet breakfast with coffee, tea, and juice and delectable snacks all day.

8.45am

Over to Wendy and enjoy!

12.30pm

Break for a buffet lunch and take in the lovely sea views from Paloma.

5pm

If you can tear yourselves away, needles down and 'home' for a little down time prior to dinner.

We have lovely beaches for a paddle or swim depending on the tide. A nature trail or just chill with a glass of wine while you contemplate your day.

6.30pm

Pickup for dinner at Paloma. We will drop you back at your accommodation when you have run out of revelling.

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ABOUT THE REDLANDS COAST

The Redlands Coast is perfectly positioned along picturesque Southern Moreton Bay, between Brisbane and the Gold Coast. Less than 30km from Brisbane, Redland City is a popular tourist destination and gateway to Brisbane's aquatic playground, the Moreton Bay Marine Park. This nature lover's paradise boasts 330km of coastline, tranquil islands, pristine beaches and peaceful hinterland, wrapped in sunshine 280 days a year. Redland City also has vibrant business districts, modern shopping centres, hundreds of restaurants and plenty of entertainment.

The indigenous Quandamooka people are believed to have been living in the Moreton Bay area for at least 20,000 years. They are the traditional owners and proud custodians of the lands and waters in much of the region today known as the Redlands. The annual Quandamooka festival from July to September is a unique opportunity to learn about the Redlands and Moreton Bay from the Quandamooka people's experience.

The islands of Southern Moreton Bay have been the home of the Nunukul and Gorenpul indigenous tribes for hundreds of centuries. The first known European to set foot on the Bay Islands was the English navigator Captain Matthew Flinders in 1799. After a penal settlement was established in 1824, convicts were harvesting timber on the islands for the next two decades. In 1842, the Moreton Bay district was opened to free settlement, and the islands continued to supply timber to the mills on the mainland. Oysters, produce and cattle farming were other business activities pursued until the 1950's.

ABOUT MACLEAY ISLAND

Macleay Island is the second largest of the Bay Islands. Macleay Island is sheltered in the vast marine park of Moreton Bay. It is rich in native flora and fauna, edged with mangrove foreshores and sandy beaches, providing respite from the outside world. An eco-tourism dream, the island offers a variety of experiences.

The island is a bird paradise, home to more than 200 species.

The calm waters are great for swimming, fishing, sea kayaking and snorkeling. Mingle with the locals playing golf, lawn bowls or tennis, explore the bicycle and heritage trails. Watch the dolphins, turtles, dugongs or go for beach walks.

Macleay Island seems to incite a creative inspiration that has drawn hundreds of artists to live and work on the island, some of whom are quite established and recognised nationally and internationally. The Arts Complex gallery is open to the public daily.
