Comment

The 2006 vintage for many Marlborough reds is probably best described by the French term “vendage de plaisir”, meaning a vintage of immediate pleasure. Traditionally the Clayvin Vineyard is the most opulent and seductive Pinot Noir in the Fromm range and this year the wine shows its soft richness and charm already in its youth.

The wine has a beautiful young, bright Pinot colour and a complex, aromatic nose of red and earthy dark fruit. The seamless palate is silky and savoury with fine, integrated tannins. Like a dancer, the wine has a lightness and transparency yet no weakness and will be a delight to drink over the next 3 – 5 years. Bottled without fining, filtering or other clarifying additives.

Short description

Generous and seductive Pinot with savoury/earthy dark fruit flavours. Seamless and silky palate surrounded by fine integrated tannins. (May 2008)

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
