

# MJ Tweed Scarf

Exclusively Designed for MJ Yarns by Matthew Hesson-McInnis

MJ Yarns: 2 Colors of Fingering Weight, 75g each

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## Notes

This scarf is named for the "3-and-1 Tweed" stitch pattern worked in two colors. This mosaic stitch pattern produces a pebbled texture with plenty of drape, and alternating two rows of two colors produces *vertical* columns of color, even though only one yarn is used in each row!

The model pictured was knit from MJ Simple Sock Fingering Weight yarn in Cerulean Twilight for Color A and Purple Dragon for Color B. The MJ Brioche Hat and this scarf together use one skein of each of two colors; knitting the hat first will dedicate the remaining yarn to the scarf.

Two sizes are given, but any width may be worked by adding or subtracting multiples of four stitches. Exact gauge is not important for a scarf, but using a needle several sizes larger than typical will produce a more pleasing drape.

**Needles:** Size US #5 (3.75mm)

**Sizes:** Roughly 5" (7") wide

#### **Abbreviations**

**K** = Knit; **P** = Purl; **RS** = Right Side; **SL** = Slip (purlwise); **ST(S)** = Stitch(es); **WS** = Wrong Side; **WYIF** = With Yarn In Front; **WYIB** = With Yarn In Back.

## Instructions

# Set-Up Using Color A

RS Cast-on 45 (57) STS.

WS SL3 WYIF, K to last 3 STS, SL3 WYIF.

#### **Pattern Repeat**

Work the following four rows until the scarf reaches the desired length, then work Rows 1 & 2 one more time.

Row 1: With Color B, K4, (SL1-WYIB, K3) across to last ST, K1.

Row 2: With Color B, SL3-WYIF, K1, (SL1-WYIF, K3) across to last 5 STS, SL1-WYIF, K1, SL3-WYIF.

Row 3: With Color A, K3, (K3, SL1-WYIB) across to last 6 STS, K6.

Row 4: With Color A, SL3-WYIF, (K3, SL1-WYIF) across to last 6 STS, K3, SL3-WYIF.

## Wrap-Up Using Color A

RS K across.

WS SL3-WYIF, K across to last 3 STS, SL3-

WYIF

RS Bind off all STS.

Weave in ends.
