


Our Lady of Kibeho School



We have completed the renovation of Our Lady of Kibeho school, which is where the first apparition of Our Lady took place. The renovation project has cost approximately \$4,000,000 so far. The school is a boarding school that accommodates 800 students. The school was previously in a dilapidated condition, but by the grace of God, we have managed to restore it. When we started the project, we had nothing, but by the grace of God, all the funds came and we finished.











Minor Seminary Nyundo



When a torrential rain storm rerouted a rapids river In Nyundo and completely flooded a minor seminary, Immaculee Charities responded to the emergency and not only fixed the flood damage but helped construct a retaining wall to prevent this from ever happening again. The total cost of the project was \$350,000. The school of 600 minorseminarians & 40 priests was restored In less than three months.







Repairing Damaged Churches



Since the genocide, there has been much damage to many churches around the country. Two especially touched my heart: one In Kibeho and one near my home village, where we attended mass as a family. We raised enough money to repair the roofs, repair holes In the outer and inner walls, build new altars with marble, and restore the sacristy to its original glory. This has been one of the biggest blessings, costing less than \$110,000 to complete.











Immaculate Conception School















Education Support



Since 2009, with your help, we have raised enough to educate thousands of school-aged children to pay their academic fees for elementary, high school boarding, and college.

Many of the children who have graduated are now working in professional fields and have gone on to do great things in science, education, tourism, and more.











Benebikira Nuns/Retirement Home



The School of the Immaculée Conception we restored Is also run by the same Benebikira Nuns. The nuns work, care, and live for the school of 800 students. The local Bishop of this province needed the building quarters where the sisters had been living. The generous land provided to them Is large enough to house aging nuns. This new convent will have rooms for 15 nuns, a common area, a kitchen, and a chapel. It will cost \$550,000 to complete. We have raised \$150,000 already. We need \$400,000 more.













Benebikira Nuns Convent



These native Rwandan nuns are trained to be nurses as well as educators. This group serves one of the very poorest in the country. Their living quarters and stables were built at the turn of the last century, and It shows. They collect their water In buckets to cook, shower, flush their toilets, and wash their hands. They have batteries for limited electricity, and the chapel, dining, and bedrooms have leaks that allow rainwater to pour in with no solution; we have raised \$50,000 but need \$350,000 to build them a new home.













Blue Veil Villa * Kibeho Retreat House



In Kibeho, where Our Lady appeared, we need a home for pilgrims to stay in when they visit the Blessed Shrine. The shrine is a blessing to others, but there must be proper places to stay. Building a retreat place with 100 rooms hosting 200 people will cost \$850,000 to start phase I. For this, I kindly ask for a donation of \$20,000 per room. For your generous help, we will dedicate this room however you wish. "Prayers for Mita's family". Each room will have a stall statue of Our Lady with the writing of "prayers for this ... family". This Holy place will heal many called to visit Our Lady of Kibeho.
