

Loop the thread over the edge of the toy back to the front side. Push your needle from the front through both pieces of felt this time, so that it comes out at the same place as your first stitch. Pull the thread through.



Loop the thread back to the right of your last stitch, and make a new stitch through both pieces of felt. Pull the thread through, but when a small loop remains, pass your needle from right to left through the loop. Then pull tight so that it makes neat stitch the shape of an upside-down L. This is known as a blanket stitch!



Continue to blanket stitch front, move 4-5mm (3/16") to the around the edge of the toy until you are half way round. If you run out of thread at any time, secure your thread to the wrong side of the felt as in steps 12-13. Start your new stitch as in steps 18-20.



Leaving the needle and thread still attached, half fill the toy with the stuffing, then add 1-2 pinches of the catnip.




Finish stitching up the toy with blanket stitch, adding stuffing and catnip as you go, ensuring it is nice and plump. When you reach the end, loop your thread through the top of the first stitch you made and tie a small knot.



Repeat to secure, then push your needle through the edge of your toy and bring it out somewhere in the middle of the back piece of felt. Take the needle off, pull the thread taught in your fingers, and snip off flush with the felt. When you let go, the snipped end will disappear neatly inside your toy.



Toy stuffing Catnip

Please keep all needles and threads away from cats. Children must be supervised by an adult.



With a pair of scissors, carefully cut out the template pieces for your toy.



and lay them squarely on top of on top and use a pencil to each other.



Take two pieces of matching felt Place the round ring toy template draw around.



Tie a knot at the opposite end of the thread. When you start stitching, make your first stitch from the back side of the felt towards the front, pulling the knot flush with the back side.



Sew the thread through your cut When you're happy with your out felt frosting piece, making a series of long stitches to resemble donut sprinkles. Begin the stitching from the reverse as described in step 10.



pattern, finish by carefully threading your needle through the back side of the felt (the messy side where the knot is).



Pin the felt squares together with the needle provided.



Cut the toy shape out from the felt. To cut out the inner circle, fold the felt in half and snip the inner semi-circle out. Remove needle and separate both felt shapes.




Repeat steps 1-3 using the frosting template and cut out. Cut out the inner circle as in step 5.



Create a loop and thread the needle through, creating a small knot to secure the thread on the back side of the felt. Repeat to ensure the thread is secure. Cut off remaining thread.



Repeat steps 9-13 for all other shades of floss to complete your donut sprinkles.



Place the felt frosting on one of the donut felt shapes. Starting as in step 10 with orange thread, make small stitches through both layers at right angles to the frosting edge. Do this around all frosting edges to attach to the donut.



For each embroidery floss provided, cut a piece the length of your arm. The floss is made up of six strands, but we will use three strands only. Tease the ends of the floss apart into two sets of three.



Pull the two sections of thread away from each other, while twisting the main floss, until completely divided into two strands of three. Repeat for all flosses provided.



Take one piece of thread (in any shade, we will be using them all!) and thread all three strands through the eye of the needle.



Place both felt donut pieces together, lining up the edges. Make sure the side with the frosting is facing towards you.



With orange thread, begin stitching 2-3 mm (1/8") from the inside edge as in step 10. Create small stitches that loop over the exposed edge, spaced a few mm apart. Continue until the inside ring is stitched, then push your thread inside the toy and secure as in step 13.



With orange thread, begin stitching 2-3mm (1/8") from the outside edge of the donut, as in step 10.
