Deurdagte Reis – ‘n viering van vrouekunstenaars Thoughtful Journey – a celebration of female artists

Quin is in Maart 1934 in Bishops Glen, Bloemfontein gebore en het aan die Hoërskool Eunice gematrikuleer. Sy het die Durbanse Kunsskool met ‘n beurs bygewoon en haar Diploma in Beeldende Kunste in 1954 met onderskeidingsverwerf, met Beeldhou as haar hoofvak. Sy het die Emma Smith-beurs ontvang en het in 1956 aan Goldsmith College, Londen gestudeer. In 1959 is sy met Etienne du Plessis getroud en sy het twee dogters, wat in Alexandria in the Oos-Kaap woon.

Quin het haar eerste solo-uitstalling in 1971 by die Suid-Afrikaanse Kunsvereniging, Pretoria gehou Gedurende haar loopbaan het sy 40 solo-uitstellings sedert haar eerste gehou en aan meer as 20 groep uitstellings deelgeneem. Die eerste oorsig-uitstalling van haar werk is in 1987, by die Universiteit van die Vrystaat gehou, gevolg deur uitstellings, in 1990, by die Anton van Wouw Huis, Universiteit van Pretoria en op die Potchefstroom kampus van die Universiteit van Noordwes.

Van 1992 tot 1999 het sy jaarliks by die Standard Bank Nasionale Kunstfees uitgestal en feeswinkel aangebied. Uitstellings in 2000 en 2001: die Universiteit van Pretoria, Noordwes Universiteit, Bloemfontein, Oliewenhuis Kunsmuseum, Port Elizabeth, Cuyler Galery en NSA - ABSA Galery in Durban. Sy het ook by die 2003 en 2006 Kunstfees, Grahamstad en die 2013 Aardklop Nasionale Kunstfees, Potchefstroom uitgestal.

Onder die groep-uitstellings waaraan sy op ‘n nasionale en internasionale grondslag deelgeneem het, is die volgende: RSA Fees-uitstalling, Merensky Trust Wood Exhibition, Uitstalling van toonaangewende SA beeldhouers, *Images of Wood Exhibition* en die ABSA-uitstalling van Oos-Kaapse kunstenaars.

Quin se naam verskyn reeds jare lank op die lys van Suid-Afrikaanse beeldhouers wat vir hul veelsydigheid aansien geniet – haar werk strek van totale realisme tot sterk abstraksie.

Die grootste van Quin se oorsig-uitstellings is in 2014 gehou as ‘n viering van haar tachtigste verjaardag en sestigste jaar as professionele beeldhouer. Dit was ‘n reisende uitstalling wat in Maart in die Oliewenhuis Kunsmuseum in Bloemfontein geopen is en gevolg is deur uitstellings in Mei by die Noordwes Universiteit, Potchefstroom-kampus, in Julie by die Sanlam Galery in Bellville, die Ann Bryant Galery in Oos-Londen in Oktober en die laaste uitstalling by die GFI Kunsgallery in Port Elizabeth gedurende Maart 2015.

As ‘n gebaar om haar loopbaan en werk met ander te deel, is die *Quin Beeldhoukuns Tuin en Galery* in Alexandria oop vir die publiek. Dit huisves haar ateljee en ‘n permanente uitstalling van meer as 100 van Quin se beelde, sketse en skilderye, met van haar studentewerk en huidige skeppings.



Quin was born in Bishops Glen, Bloemfontein in March 1934 and matriculated at Eunice High School. She attended Durban Art School on a scholarship and obtained her Diploma in Fine Arts with distinction in 1954, majoring in sculpture. Quin won the Emma Smith Bursary and studied at the Goldsmith College, London in 1956. She got married to Etienne du Plessis in 1959 and has two daughters, who live in Alexandria in the Eastern Cape.

In 1971 Quin held her first solo exhibition at the South African Association of Arts, Pretoria. During her career she has held 40 solo exhibitions since her first and has participated in more than 20 group exhibitions. The first retrospective exhibitions of her work were held in 1987, at the University of the Free State, followed by exhibitions, in 1990, at Anton van Wouw House, University of Pretoria and at North-West University, Potchefstroom campus.

From 1992 until 1999 she exhibited yearly at the Standard Bank National Arts Festival, where she also conducted festival workshops. Exhibitions in 2000 and 2001 were held at the University of Pretoria, North-West University, Bloemfontein, Oliewenhuis Art Museum, Port Elizabeth, Cuyler Gallery and NSA - ABSA Gallery in Durban. She also exhibited at the 2003 and 2006 Arts Festival, Grahamstown and the 2013 Aardklop National Arts Festival, Potchefstroom.

Amongst the group exhibitions in which she has participated on a national and international basis are: RSA Festival Exhibition, Merensky Trust Wood Exhibition, Exhibition of leading SA sculptors, *Images of Wood Exhibition* and the ABSA exhibition of Eastern Cape artists.

For years Quin has been on the list of South African sculptors who are favoured for versatile work – her work ranges from total realism to bold abstraction.

The largest of Quin's retrospective exhibitions was held in 2014 as a celebration of Quin's 80th birthday and 60th year as a professional sculptress. This was a travelling exhibition opened in March at the Oliewenhuis Art Museum in Bloemfontein, followed by exhibits in May at the North-West University, Potchefstroom campus, in July at the Sanlam Gallery in Bellville, the Ann Bryant Gallery in East London during October and a final exhibition at the GFI Art Gallery in Port Elizabeth during March 2015.

As a gesture to share her career and work, the *Quin Sculpture Garden and Gallery* in Alexandria is open to the public. This venue houses her studio and a permanent exhibition of more than 100 of Quin's sculptures, drawings and paintings, including her student work and current creations.
