



Cabinet Office carbon reduction plan guidance

Notes for Completion

Where an In-Scope Organisation has determined that the measure applies to the procurement, suppliers wishing to bid for that contract are required at the selection stage to submit a Carbon Reduction Plan which details their organisational carbon footprint and confirms their commitment to achieving Net Zero by 2050.

Carbon Reduction Plans are to be completed by the bidding supplier¹ and must meet the reporting requirements set out in supporting guidance, and include the supplier's current carbon footprint and its commitment to reducing emissions to achieve Net Zero emissions by 2050.

The CRP should be specific to the bidding entity, or, provided certain criteria are met, may cover the bidding entity and its parent organisation. In order to ensure the CRP remains relevant, a Carbon Reduction Plan covering the bidding entity and its parent organisation is only permissible where the detailed requirements of the CRP are met in full, as set out in the Technical Standard² and Guidance³, and all of the following criteria are met:

- The bidding entity is wholly owned by the parent;
- The commitment to achieving net zero by 2050 for UK operations is set out in the CRP for the parent and is supported and adopted by the bidding entity, demonstrated by the inclusion in the CRP of a statement that this will apply to the bidding entity;
- The environmental measures set out are stated to be able to be applied by the bidding entity when performing the relevant contract; and
- The CRP is published on the bidding entity's website.

Bidding entities must take steps to ensure they have their own CRP as soon as reasonably practicable and should note that the ability to rely on a parent organisation's Carbon Reduction Plan may only be a temporary measure under this selection criterion.

The Carbon Reduction Plan should be updated regularly (at least annually) and published and clearly signposted on the supplier's UK website. It should be approved by a director (or equivalent senior leadership) within the supplier's organisation to demonstrate a clear commitment to emissions reduction at the highest level. Suppliers may wish to adopt the key objectives of the Carbon Reduction Plan within their strategic plans.



In order to continue our progress to achieving Net Zero, we have adopted the following carbon reduction targets.

Completed Carbon Reduction Initiatives

- The following environmental management measures and projects have been implemented since the 2022 baseline. We do not yet have the figures determining the total carbon emission reduction achieved by these schemes, however we plan on collating this data at the end of the 2023 financial year. Once the data has been collated, we will update this policy to highlight the total and % carbon reduction achieved as a result of these schemes. We recognise with our supply chain and the makeup of our business that category 1 purchased goods and services will be the most material category of emissions.
- Gailarde is ISO 14001 certified.
- Achieved Ecovadis Gold Rating.
- Signatory of the SME climate Hub.
- Relocated to a new warehouse, bringing all our logistics operations in-house. This new facility is all electric, has one hundred percent LED lighting and is powered by one hundred percent renewable electricity.
- We are transitioning our entire corporate fleet to hybrid vehicles. To ensure full commitment to reducing our carbon footprint, we partner with freight forwarders who share our commitment to sustainability who have implemented measures such as using electric vehicles to deliver packages.
- We have increased the proximity of our partner's locations across the country to cut down on carbon emissions from transport.



In the future we hope to implement further measures such as:

- Improve our data collection to track our carbon emissions and year-on-year reductions more accurately to review other scope 3 categories.
- Meet with all freight forwarding partners to identify further carbon reduction opportunities.
- Conduct an energy audit at Sawtry Warehouse to identify energy efficiency opportunities.

Declaration and Sign Off

This Carbon Reduction Plan has been completed in accordance with PPN 06/21 and associated guidance and reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans.

Emissions have been reported and recorded in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the GHG Reporting Protocol corporate standard⁴ and uses the appropriate Government emission conversion factors for greenhouse gas company reporting⁵.

Scope 1 and Scope 2 emissions have been reported in accordance with SECR requirements, and the required subset of Scope 3 emissions have been reported in accordance with the published reporting standard for Carbon Reduction Plans and the Corporate Value Chain (Scope 3) Standard⁶.
