This bright set of 8 posters shares the new Framework with staff, families, and children. It explains the principles and practices that underpin your program and practice. The 5 Learning Outcomes of V2.0 are displayed on a poster for each outcome

They are designed to promote children's agency with first-person descriptions of children's learning. The posters include a short description of each Learning Outcome to share the importance with families.

Dobble is the game of quick reactions and matching pairs. In this game, the pairs are all your favourite characters and items from the world of The Gruffalo. It is a simple game and it features circular cards, with a whole bunch of different images on them. Your aim is to be quick enough to locate a pair of images that sit on both your card, and the top card!

Post-game, children can engage in creating themed artwork based on the characters and items they found during their Dobble matches. This activity allows children to express their creativity and connection to the story of The Gruffalo through various art forms.






Don't forget to take notes with all of these experiences! In Early Childhood Education and Care, jottings play a crucial role as a form of observation and documentation. Jottings are concise, brief notes or records made by educators to capture significant moments, behaviours, or interactions of children in their care. These observations are integral to the EYLF, as they support the principles and practices of the framework, emphasising the importance of understanding and responding to children's interests, strengths, and learning styles.

After all of your observations and reflections let's link it all to the Quality Areas. This Evidence Summary is complete with guidance on the National Quality Standard and evidence pages for each Quality Area, helping you succeed at exceeding NQS.

Each Quality Area is followed by an Evidence Page that captures details of the evidence you've collected, where it is kept, and which element it relates to.

The Evidence Summary is the perfect Assessment and Rating Tool, keeping a detailed record of your compliance that can easily be shared with Assessors. It also strengthens the Quality Improvement Plan by highlighting areas requiring additional attention.
