

## **USES FOR HONEY BUCKET**

- Honey Screen
- Honey Storage
- Bottling
- Filling Hive Feeders

## **ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. Wash with hot, soapy water. Rinse and dry completely.
- 2. Unscrew Plastic Nut leaving the Rubber O-Ring on the honey gate against the Plastic Flange.
- 3. Insert gate into hole on bucket. Make sure Rubber O-Ring is on the OUTSIDE of the bucket.
- 4. Hand tighten Plastic Nut (inside bucket). Use caution to not over-tighten when using tools.
- 5. Adjust Honey Gate Lever to be horizontal on the bucket (like picture at right).
- 6. Again, wash with hot soapy water. Check that the bucket is not leaking from the Honey Gate. Tighten the nut more if it is leaking.
- 7. Open Honey Gate letting hot soapy water run out into the sink. Rinse and dry completely.



## **EXTRACTION INSTRUCTIONS**

Now your Honey Bucket is assembled, washed and ready to use! Place your Honey Bucket under your extractor. You may need to elevate your extractor so the bucket will fit under. Remove lid and place metal sieve on top of Honey Bucket. The sieve removes wax and any extra impurities from your honey. Once your extractor starts filling up with

honey, open your honey gate on the extractor and let the unfiltered honey pour through the sieve and into the Honey Bucket. Adjust the honey gate level to reduce the flow of honey so the metal sieve can process the amount efficiently. Wait 24 hours to bottle so the air bubbles will come to the surface.
