## YARDAGE REQUIREMENTS

**Note:** Fabrics with nap, pile, or one-way design are not suitable for this garment.

The traditional **tan** or **kimono** bolt may not be long enough for tall people, although you can make **shoulder yoke** from another scrap fabric.

**For heights differing from those given,** add or subtract 2"/5cm of fabric for each 1"/2.5cm of difference in height.

To make a street-length (mid-calf) dress, subtract  $\frac{1}{2}$  yd/46cm from above yardages.

\*On 36"/91cm wide fabric only, if neck overband must be cut on lengthwise grain of goods because of design considerations, add ¾ yd/69cm to all sizes.
