



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In Memoriam

The month of November is traditionally when the Church remembers those that have died. During this month, we are invited to pray for our family members and friends who have passed away, whether they died recently or a longer time ago.



In company with Christ, who died and now lives, may they rejoice in your kingdom, where all our tears are wiped away.


Unite us together again in one family, to sing your praise forever and ever.
