PRAYING AS A FAMILY







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Dear Parents: The Pope calls the home to be "the place where we learn to appreciate the meaning and beauty of faith," and where we learn "to pray and to serve our neighbour." He believes it "is essential that children actually see that, for their parents, prayer is something truly important."

Young children, who need a routine to help them learn and grow, will find that prayer becomes a key moment in their daily lives.

So, are you ready to begin? To help you, we wrote this book of prayers for various times: from waking up in the morning to feeling angry or sad, sharing meals together, and much more.

When you pray together, it is best to find a quiet place where the whole family will feel at ease and can sit comfortably. Take time for silence to make room for God in your lives and in your hearts, and use a few gestures, postures and objects that remind you of God. A candle, lit before the prayer begins, is a sign of Christ's presence. During the listening time, you can gather closer to the candle: the Word of God will guide you and light your way. The candle will be extinguished at the end of the prayer.

The prayer can include several steps, which are indicated by small icons:

The Sign of the Cross, which opens and closes the prayer. Children will gradually learn this gesture by imitating you.

Sharing, where the children, as well as you, the parents, are invited to take turns speaking. This part helps children learn the importance of listening to others.

Distening is the time where you will read the Word of God aloud. The biblical texts are included in this booklet, but it is better to read them from a Bible as a sign that God's Word is an important part of our faith.


Praying aloud together lets both parents and children know they are part of the large Christian family.

May the Lord bless our family, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.


AUDIO: 1. SIGN OF THE CROSS
