Dear Child,


How would you like to go on a wonderful journey, one that will take you closer to God?

Words to Remember ...

Feel the air entering your body and giving it life. Then say out loud, "My voice, too, is a gift from God."



Smile a big smile and then open your eyes. Slowly stand up, raise your arms, and start moving them all around. Kick your feet up and down.

Saint Francis Loved Life

You can say, "Dear God, you are great. Thanks so much for all you do."


