

So what is the corresponding text to this secret code?


# Immaculate Conception

# Glass Catechism

Few people could read in the Middle Ages. To tell them the stories from the Bible, church builders created a catechism in glass: large stained glass windows that explained the Bible. These are called stained glass windows. You will find stained glass windows in many churches, especially in older ones. Special artists create such pictures in glass.

# Relics

The word *relic* comes from a Latin word that means "remains." These are the physical remains of a saint—a piece of bone, a drop of blood, or an object that belonged to him or her. It can even be a piece of clothing that he or she has worn. These precious relics are often kept in beautiful boxes called reliquaries. Some people like to pray before relics, remembering the saint and asking him or her to pray to God for them.
