Upon her death, Prowse bequeathed her home, *The Retreat*, for use as an art centre, and 4 years later, in 1971, the school was opened by the renowned artist, Erik Laubscher. Today, the historic Roodebloem Estate which houses the school is recognised as a national monument.

50 years later, the school continues to honour its origins and the legacies of both Prowse and Laubscher whose contributions to the creative arts and education sectors in South Africa are unparalleled.

Our programmes include:


- Fine Art


Through our **Scholarship Fund**, the Ruth Prowse School of Art offers **financial aid** and support to individuals who show academic potential and are in need of financial assistance.

Support from the Fund covers fees, art materials, transport support and subsistence support.

The Scholarship Fund in Numbers:

- 20 learners supported each year*
- 25% of our student body supported
- R5,500 per learner per month

*Annually, the school receives many more applications than this.
