The fruit is sourced from Block 1 in the estate vineyard in Wilyabrup, from 48yo low-yielding semillon and sauvignon blanc vines. Both varieties were picked early and pressed together, then co-fermented in 2nd- and 3rd-use barrels; mlf was blocked and the lees left unstirred. The oak impact is evident on the nose, however the fruit has the requisite intensity to hold its own in this space. Very elegant.

VINTAGE 2019

The fruit is sourced from Block 1 in the estate vineyard in Wilyabrup, from 48yo low-yielding semillon and sauvignon blanc vines. Block 1 has some of the oldest semillon and sauvginon blanc vines on the property. It's rare to find such a combination of finesse, elegance, intensity and length. The barrel ferment element is of minor importance but does contribute to this special wine.

Top Rank - 3 of 23 Semillon Blends from Australia

Straw-yellow colour with a healthy glow. Lemon sherbert, minerals and a hint of toasty oak when swirled. The oak influence more apparent when sipped - it's a positive - grapefruit and lemon acidity clean the finish. Still to fully integrate. Will continue to improve.

91 Points | James Suckling

This takes a restrained stance with stony aromas, lemon pith and grapefruit. There's a very fresh, very raw feel that is appealing. The palate has a sleek, juicy and freshly tangy feel with an elegant, long finish. Drink or hold. Screw cap.

VINTAGE 2017

94 Points | Ray Jordan's Top 100 Whites

This is a classy Margaret River blend where oak plays a viotal role. The fruit comes from one of the oldest vineayrds in the region and in this case was picked at low baume, so the alcohol is low. It's had 11 months in oak after fermenation, but no lees stirring.

95 Points | James Halliday Wine Companion 2020

Block 1 was planted in the early '70s on a high ridge overlooking the Wilyabrup Valley. Has developed full straw-green colour, reflecting the low yields and subtle use of oak. The impact on the mouth is substantial, the wine likely to become even more complex in the manner of many SSBs.

VINTAGE 2016

97 Points | James Halliday Wine Companion

Pale straw-green; has more intensity and citrussy acidity than the '15 at this stage, the latter busy morphing from a newborn to adolescent. The '16 is a superb young Block 1 with greatness now, or in five or 15 years' time. Drink to 2028
