TRAVELING? Be sure to transport your butterflies in the original shipping box or a portable cooler. Avoid leaving your butterflies in direct sunlight or prolonged exposure to high heat. (No parked cars, etc.)

NOTE: If you are doing a mass release, please read the special suggestions on the Mass Release Instruction sheet about travelling with the butterflies and the best time to make the transfer.

<u>COLD OR RAINING?</u> - Butterflies need temperatures of 65°F and up to be able to fly well. They will not fly in the rain. If you need to delay your release by a day due to inclement weather simply keep the butterflies in the shipping box and follow steps 3-5 on the previous page.

PHOTO SHOOT SUGGESTIONS: If you want to position a butterfly for a close-up, or want the butterfly to stay longer, simply place the desired number of butterflies (kept in their original packages) into the refrigerator for 15 to 30 minutes. This brings down their body temperature so that they can't move quickly. You will have approximately 30 seconds before the butterfly warms up enough to fly. They can also be enticed to stay longer if you place them on a flower or a sugar water mixture.
