

# PANEL SPACING

Measuring tool guides are provided for three, four, five, and seven panel pieces to make hanging with one inch spacing between panels as simple as possible.



However, one inch spacing is just a suggestion. You can create any number of eye catching displays. Hang horizontally, vertically, or stagger as desired.



#### **CLEANING**

We reccomend that white cotton gloves are worn when handling the artwork.

To remove fingerprints from silver artwork, use a soft white cloth and wipe with rubbing alcohol.


To clean painted artwork, simply wipe with a damp cloth.

# HANGING INSTRUCTIONS


1. Carefully remove packaging and lay each panel on a soft surface (or on the foam) face down with the bracket facing towards the ceiling.



2. Place your hand on the center of the bracket to brace it. Bend one end of the bracket using the inner perforation, so that it forms a  $90^{\circ}$  angle. Do the same to the other side.




3. Now bend the outer perforations towards the ends of the panel to form a 90° degree zig-zag.



4. Tape the provided measuring tool guide on your desired hanging wall. The green line indicates the center of the artwork. Mark above each line on the ribbon. At each mark, insert a screw or nail. (Screws/nails not provided by Statements 2000). Be sure to use a level or measuring tape to ensure alignment is correct.

## LIGHTING OPTIONS

Lighting is key. A few lights directed at your wall art will create a world class installation. Bright white, high kelvin lighting will give the work a crisp, modern pop. Warmer, low kelvin lighting will invite ambient tones to reflect on your art – this is especially true for silver pieces.
