What fabrics work best for custom fabric jewebry?

Woven Fabrics:
Woven fabrics are formed by interlocking threads at right angles, or warp \& wefts.
These fabrics typically do not have stretch and are made of a variety of fibers including but not limited to cotton, wool, polyester, silk, satin, and linen.

Examples:
WOVENS THAT WILL WORK:
Oxford shirts, ties, satin dresses handkerchiefs, quilting cottons, bandannas, blazers, denim \& chinos

WOVENS THAT WILL NOT WORK:
woven lace, sheer fabrics, loosely woven fabrics like sarape, fabrics with fused interfacing, beaded or embroidered fabrics


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## WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT KNITS

Knit fabrics come in many varieties.
The knit fabrics with two-way stretch, like those found in $t$-shirts work in our fabric jewelry designs due to the way the fabric construction is interlocked. Two-way stretch fabrics will only stretch in one direction, vertically or horizontally.

However, other knit fabrics like sweaters, lace, spandex or lycra, mesh, piled knits like fleece or velour, and handmade knit fabrics do not work in our custom designs because the construction of the fabric unravels when we cut it, due to the way the threads lock.

## KNITS THAT WILL NOT WORK:

Handmade knit scarves \& hats Sweaters
4-way stretch fabrics
Sheer stretch fabrics
