Watercolour Painting Outdoors Basic Equipment Checklist

Keep your equipment minimal Weight is a big factor

	Medium size backpack with multiple sections and pockets.
	Small sketchbook or loose watercolour papers or both, but remember the weight. Taking too much will be heavy. Use 200gsm-300gsm 100% cotton as it shouldn't buckle.
	A few bulldog clips for holding your palette to your sketchbook
	Watercolour half pan palette set, pans are easier than tubes when you are outdoors, hopefully with an inbuilt palette.
	Lightweight plastic water pots and spray bottle. Great for keeping paint pans moist.
	Water bottle, 500ml, not too big! Think about the weight. Water brushes filled with water are great for outdoor painting.
	Graphite, and mechanical pencil, eraser.
	Brushes, flat, round, mop and wash.
	A small sponge, some wax crayons for texture. Paper tissue for mopping up.
\bigcirc	Small camping chair or stool or blow up cushion to sit on.
	Waterproof clothes.
	Lightweight umbrella.
	Camera or phone camera to capture your vista.
	View finder to help you focus on your vista

	Map of the area, if you on unfamiliar territory.
