Salvation is found in A PERSON And only **ONE PERSON!**

LEADER'S MESSAGE GUIDE

This Leader's Guide is prepared to help the Study Group Leader to keep the discussions moving along. Maybe your people will come up with different answers, or perhaps they will need a little prompting from you.

Remember, you want to encourage your people to fully participate. This is not a 'teaching session' by the Group Leader, but rather a discussion group. This may at first seem like a contradiction, but you will need for the Lord to give you wisdom to keep the discussions 'on track' whilst also allowing the Holy Spirit to direct your path.

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LEADER'S MESSAGE **GUIDE & QUESTIONS**

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PART 1 – WAITING PATIENTLY Acts 1:1-11

- 1. These verses tell us the 'purpose of Acts', as written by the Luke, who also wrote the Gospel bearing his name.
- 2. The Book of Acts provides a bridge of understanding between the Gospels and the Pauline Epistles.
- 3. As we look at the period of transition between 'the resurrection' and the 'birth of the church' on Pentecost, we are going to look at 3 things:
 - i. The Patience Required
 - ii. The Power Promised
 - iii The Prayer that is Constant
- 4. Apart from the obvious, what is it that links the Gospel of Luke with the 'Acts of the Apostles?
 - The Gospel of Luke is all about what Jesus began to do and to teach. The Book of Acts is a recording of what HE continues to be doing and teaching, but now through His Body the Church.
- 5. This is the essential starting ground for us before we enter Christian service... Why? Because: It is not about 'us' doing it. It is about Him doing it. It is not about 'us' teaching. It is about Him teaching. It is about Him leading. It is about Him increasing, and us losing ourselves in Him.

Our understanding of this essential truth is foundational to how we live the Christian life. Because we continually forget and drift from this understanding, it becomes a repeated lesson in the Christian life.

6. Because Jerusalem had become a dangerous place for them since Jesus had been crucified. Having basked in the triumphal entry with Jesus, they were now afraid of being recognized as the disciples of Jesus. Things can change so quickly.

In our western society we make 'the church' to be a safe haven from the troubles of the world. We retreat into 'holy huddles'. But that was not an option for the church in the New Testament.

They were 'commanded' to wait in a dangerous place.

The disciples were not good at waiting, and spent their time speculating on the future; but Jesus was not going to reveal that to them.

Sometimes God just says 'Wait' and trust me for your future... It is not for you to know.

- Times of waiting and not knowing foster our dependence upon Him. As we get older, mature believers actually become content with not knowing.
- 9. ii. The Power Promised Read again and consider 1 Acts 4, 5 & 8
- 10. The gift is His Holy Spirit, which provides us with His Power, so that we can effectively witness to the saving Grace of Jesus Christ.
 - The Spirit is the one doing His work And we get to go along for the ride. As we cooperate with His leading.

- 11. Well for a start Acts 1:10 & 11. And then verses 12-14
 - iii. Prayer that is Vital Be obedient to the instructions you do have. Join together constantly in Prayer.

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PART 2 – FROM BEING SCATTERED TO BEING GATHERED Genesis 11

- This will form the basis of our study today.
- 2. A quick summary of human history up to this point:

In Genesis 3 – Satan tempts Eve – you will be like God – sin enters the human condition.

In Genesis 6 – The sinfulness of man is so great that God sends the flood.

In Genesis 9-10 – God establishes a covenant with man and creation - the nations are told to multiply and spread out across the earth.

- This is exemplified in Genesis 11 The Tower of Babel. Mankind has an awareness of God - but still does not 'know' God.
- 4. Nimrod was a mighty warrior and hunter; and he becomes the founder of an Empire which includes Babel.

There is only one language spoken amongst all the people.

5. God's command: read Genesis 9:7 Multiply and increase [scatter] across the land

Man's plan: read Genesis 11:4 They do not want to scatter, instead they want to reach up to God. The problem is our flesh, and satanic forces seize control of the condition - and express all manner of worship that is actually an affront to God

- 6. If the people were left to their own devices the natural sinfulness of man would cause him to reach up and try to be like God; essentially the same thing that tempted Adam and Eve. It was actually an act of mercy on God's part to confuse and scatter this movement.
- 7. It is not just humanistic tendencies of our sinfulness - it is also spiritual forces at work. 'The name Babel thus stands forever as a reminder of the failure of godless folly'.
- 8. It is important to notice that God calls Abram away from all that he knows - his country, his people, his family - to discover all that God will show him. And imbedded into this call is from his [Abram's] way to God's way.

I will make you. I will bless you. I will make your name great. You will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you. Whoever curses you I will curse. All peoples on earth will be blessed through you.

God's word to Abram: leave your ways, and follow mine.

The very life of God, lost in the Garden of Eden, is restored to humanity through the finished work of Jesus on the Cross. Acts 2 is about God gathering all nations, all people under heaven, all tongues, and DECLARING His fulfilled PLAN of Salvation that HE had purposed from the very moment sin entered upon the human condition.

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PART 3 – A WHOLE NEW FREEDOM Acts 3:1-0

- 1. Our study today will break down into 3 sections:
 - i. Born Into Bondage
 - ii Brutal Truth
 - iii Bringing Good News

2. i. Born Into Bondage

- Israel was a covenant nation based on the Law
- All children would have been schooled on the first 5 books of the Bible.
- There are 13 verses of blessing for obedience.
- There are 53 verses of curses for disobedience.
- People would be exiled for disobedience to the Covenant.
- They had a 'law based' legislated relationship with God.
- One of the common perceptions within this system of New Testament religion was that sickness, lameness and disease was a curse for din in you life?
 - Read and consider John 9:2. Even Jesus' disciples had that attitude towards sickness during their time with Jesus.
- 4. Life under this Old Covenant was brutal for all humanity, but for the disabled and blind etc. it was impossible. A constant reminder that they cannot 'enter in', and that there is distance between them and God.
- 5. i We are all equally born into bondage.
 - ii We are born spiritually crippled from birth.
 - iii No matter how hard we try, Religious good behavior does not save us, and does not liberate us from our bondage.

- iv The LAW could only reveal our inability our sin.
- v. The Law leaves us helpless outside of the holiness of God.
- vi Still separated by the curtain.

The Law could only pronounce a person to be unclean it can only expose our condition.

- 6. It enables us to enter into God's presence, and walk with those burdens lifted from us.
- 7. Hebrews 8:13. By calling the covenant 'new', he has made the 'Old' one obsolete.
- The Gospel of Jesus Christ restores us. And it's all about HIM.
- 9. Peter uses this event to drive home the Truth and the Message of the Gospel! We can be healed because of Jesus only. Period!
- 10. Look beyond the miracle to the message. God moves around us to awaken us from our ignorance.

What covenant are you under? The Old – where all you can see is your disability, and the distance between you and God? Or the New - where all you see is Christ and the freedom you have?

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PART 4 – NO OTHER NAME Acts 4:1-22

- 1. This will be the basis for our study today.
- 2. We say things like: He/she has a 'good' name. His/her name was dragged through the mud. In Acts 4 we learn that there is a name that stands out amongst all names throughout history.

- 3. Today we will explore what happens as a result of this proclamation of this New Covenant, under these 3 headings:
 - i. The Confines of Careless Theology
 - ii. The Courage of Truth
 - iii. The Centrality of the Name

4. Who were the Sadducees?

- They were an influential group among the Sanhedrin, highly educated and well-off - they were the Aristocracy of Israel.
- The High Priest and Temple Authorities were Sadducees, and they were in charge of Temple Worship.
- They were among the group that rejected Jesus as the 'son of God' or 'messiah'.

What was their Theology?

- They believed that God's covenant with the Jewish people centered around proper Temple observance.
- They didn't believe in the Resurrection so they didn't believe in the afterlife.
- They did not believe in the existence of angels or demons.
- They rejected the 'tradition of the elders' and insisted on only obeying the laws of Moses.

This was a major source of conflict between the Sadducees and the Pharisees since they don't hold to the traditions or rabbinical teachings.

- 5. What were the 'Confines of their Confused or Careless Theology?
 - They were concerned because Peter & John were teaching the Resurrection.
 - Their theology was getting in the way of their accepting Christ.
 - Despite the NEW covenant being confirmed through the message of Jesus Christ with miracles, signs and wonders... they were still trying to maintain the OLD covenant. Read and consider John 5:39-40
 - But perhaps worst of all; Their 'theology had become their God'.

- 6. In these verses Paul is warning Timothy about bad theology and contaminated doctrine.
- 7. Acts 4:5-7. ii. The Courage of Truth They were tested by the question, "By what power or what name do you do this?' And Peter responded with Acts 4:8-12
- 8. Peter and John were now filled with courage. Why? Because they had been with Jesus, and they were now filled with the Holy Spirit
- 9. This verse could be the most important verse you will ever hear, and it is what is central in all of human history! "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name

under heaven given to men by which we must be saved"

10. And we close by reading and considering Romans 3:19 & 20

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PART 5 – THE HEART OF THE MATTER Acts 4:32-5:11

- This will form the basis of today's study.
- 2. The 3 ways in which the Enemy attacks the early church in Acts are: Persecution | Moral Compromise | False Teaching
- 3. i. Grace Filled Generosity
 - ii. Greed Filled Hypocrisy

- This is the second time in as many chapters that Luke draws attention to the health of the early Church, it was :-
 - Multi-generational, multi-ethnic, speaking many languages.
 - It numbered approximately 5,000 men not including women and children.
 - It was of one heart and mind.
 - That oneness was manifest in their generosity of sharing their possessions.

In fact, look again at what it says in verses 33 & 34 of Acts 4

- What was at work in them was: GRACE: the free and unmerited favor of God.
- Through **GENEROSITY**.
 - They gave VOLUNTARILY.
 - Not under law because they HAD to, but because they were so overwhelmed by His Grace that they WANTED to.
 - People of means sold houses and property to meet the needs of others.
 - Text gives no indication that there people made themselves poor in doing so.

A Grace-filled Heart is a Generous Heart: When you full realize and receive His amazing grace, generosity follows. In Acts 4: God's Grace was so powerfully at work in them, that there was no needy person among them.

- 7. In the case of Ananias & Sapphira:
 - That situation escalated very quickly.
 - Peter spoke just one sentence and Ananias falls dead.
 - No discussion just an accusation through Peter.
- The offense was not the holding back the money; The offense was the lie! It was the hypocrisy! They lack integrity. They said it was all they had received - but it was only a part of the sum total. They could not be trusted!

- 9. Why would Ananias and his wife sell a property, but keep back some of the money, and then lie about it?
 - It was not Grace that was at the heart of this gift It was Greed.
 - Greed for the praise of others.
 - Greed for a good reputation.
 - The so-called 'gift' was rooted in selfish motives

You can appear to be charitable, but it can be done out of an impure heart!

10. Are we **Honest** before God, or are we **Hypocritical** before Him?

The New Covenant Series

PART 6 – THE CHALLENGE **OF LEADERSHIP**

Acts 6:1-7

- This will be the basis for our study today.
- 2. i. Cultural Awareness
 - ii. Leadership Awareness
 - iii. Change Awareness
- There is no denial that cultural tension did exist in the early church. Although we are a 'new creation' when we come to Christ, our old nature and upbringing will be challenges as Jesus brings things to the surface of our lives.

When we come to Christ, part of His work in our lives us planting His Gospel Culture - that begins to challenge and uproot our human culture.

On top of the cultural awareness, this event cultivates leadership awareness among the Apostles, as the church has grown to such a size that diversity in leadership roles and responsibilities are required,

- 4. Leadership Awareness
 - The church has grown rapidly.
 - The daily distribution of food is an important responsibility of the church.
 - Proper oversight of this ministry is required.
 - That requires time and energy to do it well.
 - As this part of the compassion ministry grows the question becomes, how do they provide oversight to this growing part of the ministry?
 - How do they manage the demands on their time?

Some people complain that the modern church operates like a Corporation, but it is important for us to remember that we serve a King – Who is establishing a Kingdom. Kingdoms must have organization – otherwise they fall.

- 5. There are a number of gifts required in the healthy organization of a Church body. These gifts enable healthy growth and development, and we need to have Leadership Awareness that clarifies priorities and delegates responsibilities appropriately.
- 6. The Apostles were to be His witnesses and proclaim the Gospel
 but as the social compassion aspect grows in scope, so it will
 demand more of our time.

In order for this challenge to be addressed, a change needs to occur. We need to have awareness of WHEN change is required.

7. Change Awareness

- The Apostles rightly discern their function.
- The Apostles rightly focus on prayer and preaching because that was the primary function.
- It wasn't a matter if status, but of functionality they were to be His witnesses, and the Church was 'devoted to the teaching of the Apostles'.
- 8. In this 'change' 3 great management principles are implemented.
 - i. Involve the people in the change process.
 - ii. Set a criteria for decision making.
 - iii. Endorse the new leadership.
- 9. The results speak for themselves:
 - The Word of God spread
 - The number of disciples increased rapidly.
 - A large number of priests became obedient to the faith.
 - As the Church reorganized explosive growth occurred.
 - The delegation of responsibilities to trustworthy competent disciples was a part of God's plan for the Kingdom's expansion.
 - The Priesthood of all believers every part doing its designed function promotes growth within the Body and enables more people to be reached.
 - This is a crucial lesson for the Church?

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
