

The Merriam-Webster dictionary defines rain as:
"water falling in drops condensed from vapor in
 the atmosphere ", in other words, drops of water falling from the sky.

Have some fun creating your raindrops from scraps of fabric letting the memories of the quilts you made with those fabrics wash over you and bring you joy and inspiration.

Start with a square of background fabric about 14 inches square, so that you can trim it to the finished size of $12.5^{\prime \prime}$ when you are finished.

Gather up scraps of fabric and fuse a 2 -sided interfacing to the back. Using any raindrop outline, or free-handing it, cut your raindrops and arrange them as desired. Make them into flowers or umbrellas, even!

Once you have it satisfactorily arranged, fuse it all in place and quilt as desired.
