sewpowerful Scrap Fabric Heart Charm Note Card

Difficulty Level: Medium (Machine Sewing and Ironing Required)

This cute note card uses up little shreds of fabric and thread to make a darling charm. Just press and sew. I like to add the watersoluble stabilizer to ensure I catch all the fabrics in the stitching. Some like to stitch without it. The fusible means the edges are finished with an edge stitch!

Supplies

- Thin (1/8") strips of scrap fabrics •
- **Fusible interfacing**
- Mesh Water-Soluble Stabilizer •
- Iron •
- Sewing Machine
- Industrial Hole Punch or Awl
- Waxed paper •
- Cardstock •
- Matching 1/8" wide ribbon or string

Instructions

- 1. Gather a pile of fabric shreds (I like to use a cluster of compatible colors from my scrap pile)
- 2. Spread onto a 3" square of fusible interfacing
- 3. Cover with a sheet of waxed paper
- 4. Iron until all shreds are adhered to interfacing
- 5. Remove waxed paper
- 6. Cover with 3" square of water-soluble stabilizer
- 7. Stitch the sandwich across and down and around many times on your machine (I make "X"s and circles)
- 8. Run under warm water until all watersoluble stabilizer rinses away
- 9. Allow to dry
- 10. If desired, starch for added body and stiffness
- 11. You may want to stitch lace or decorative stitching around border but it is not necessary
- 12. Punch hole in top and hang on note card* with a ribbon or colorful string
