4 things you can do to help lessen the occurrence of major reactions.....



Priming the lashes can help with curing time of adhesive. This helps cut the amount of time fumes could potentially bother your client.



Wash your clients eyes beefore you start, after you superbond at the end, and make sure they are washing their lashes AT HOME!




Without a bonder, most adhesive won't fully cure for 60 hours! W/ a bonder it's ~ 5 min. This can drastically cut reactions.



Just because your client has reacted to one glue, does not mean they will react to all adhesive. Pls. be very careful when trialing adhesives. Do your research!

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4 things you can do to help avoid minor reactions....



When using tape to pull the lid up, make sure you are not opeing the eye. Fumes will get in and irritate the eye.

If your client is a talker and keeps fluttering their eyes, put on a podcast. Fluttering will allow fumes in and cause redness.

Make sure your extensions are not too close to the eyelid! If they are touching, this can block hair follicles and cause itching, redness & swelling!

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
