Focus Skill: Consonant Blends

This book features words with consonant blends for decoding practice: cl, st, mp, ng, sw, tr, fl, etc.

### **Decoding Skills:**

- Set 1 Skills: Letter-Sound Correspondence, Word Building, CVC Words
- Consonant Blends
- Consonant Digraphs

## **Discussion Questions:**

- 1. What kind of bug was Scamp chasing? Use evidence from the story to support your answer.
  - Possible Answers: bee; wasp; hornet / it is black and yellow; it stung Scamp
- 2. Why did the bugs come out of their nest? Possible Answers: Scamp dug up the nest; Scamp bothered them
- 3. How did Scamp's family try to help him after he got stung?
  - Possible Answers: they gave him a bath; they took him to the vet
- 4. What is Scamp wearing on page 16? Why do you think he is wearing it? Possible Answers: a cone; an e-collar / to keep him from licking his bumps

# **Extension Activity:**

# My Word Hive



Materials: Word Hive printable, pencil

**Purpose:** Students will add beginning sounds to provided rimes to build word families using the My Word Hive printable.

#### **Procedure:**

- 1. Print My Word Hive printable (one copy per student or one copy per group).
- 2. Sound out the rime at the top of the hive.
- 3. Think about a sound (letter, blend, or digraph) you could add to the beginning of the rime to make a word.
- 4. Write your new word on the line below the rime.
- 5. Keep creating words and adding them until you have a hive full of words!

#### **Variations:**

- Students can complete this activity independently, in partners or small groups, or one-on-one with a helper.
- Print the My Word Hive printable on cardstock, or laminate the page and vowel tiles, for repeated use (e.g., in a phonics center).
- Extra practice: encourage students to focus on building words with single-letter onsets only.
- Challenge: encourage students to fill their hives using only blend/digraph onsets.
- Challenge: encourage students to think of a new rime and build an additional word family.
