Focus Skill: Long and short vowels
This book features words with long and short vowel sounds for decoding practice.

## Decoding Skills:

- Set 1 Skills: Letter-Sound Correspondence, Word Building, CVC Words
- Set 2 Skills: Consonant Blends, Consonant Digraphs, Double Consonants
- CVCe words
- Vowel Teams


## Discussion Questions:

1. Where does this story take place? How do you know?

Possible Answers: in the country; in a park; in a field / there are no roads or buildings: there is a lot of grass and plants/ there are no people
2. During what season does this story take place? Support your answer with evidence from the story.
Possible Answers: spring: summer / it is sunny; there are flowers; there is a picnic; there is no snow
3. Why are the bees attracted to the flowers and the bottle of lime drink?
Possible Answer: bees like sweet smells
4. Why does the last bee fly down to the farm?
Possible Answer: to meet his friends


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## Extension Activity:

## Long \& Short Vowel Sort

Materials: Long \& Short Vowel Sort printable, crayons or colored pencils, scissors (optional)

Purpose: Students will discern long and short vowel sounds.

## Procedure:

1. Print Long \& Short Vowel Sort printable (one copy per student).
2. Read each word on page 1 of the printable. If a word has a long vowel sound, color it red. If a word has a short vowel sound, color it blue.
3. Keep going until you have colored in all the words.

## Variations:

- Students can complete this activity independently, in partners or small groups, or one-on-one with a helper. Each student should complete their own copy.
- Laminate the Long \& Short Vowel Sort printable for repeated use (e.g., in a phonics center).
- Extra practice: encourage students to read each pair of words (printable page 2) and identify the long and short vowel sound in each pair. Color the word with a long vowel sound red; color the word with a short vowel sound blue.
- Challenge: encourage students to complete page 3 by thinking of more examples of words with each long and short vowel sound and writing their words in the table.
